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### School District and Community

Auburn is a suburban, industry based community with a population of over 45,000 located approximately 25 miles south of Seattle, WA. The Auburn School District is a public school district serving 13,200 students grades K – 12. There are 3 comprehensive high schools and an alternative high school. Auburn Mountainview High School is the newest of these schools, having opened our doors in the fall of 2005.

### Auburn Mountainview High School

AMHS is a comprehensive 4 year public high school with a student body of 1,430. Our facility boasts state of the art science classrooms, a beautiful performing arts center, a fully functioning greenhouse, and turf athletic fields that rival those of the Seahawks. ### Curriculum/Grading

AMHS uses the standard six period Carnegie Unit credit system. The successful completion of a semester course earns one-half credit. Graduation for the class of 2010 requires 22.5 of 24 credits earned in the following areas: English: 4, Mathematics: 3, Social Studies: 2.5, Science 2.0, PE/Health: 2, Occupational Credit: 1, Fine and Performing Arts: 1. In addition, a Culminating Portfolio and passing scores on the Washington state assessment is required. Grading Scale: A = 4.0 with D = 1.0 being the lowest grade earned. All courses except alternative education and assistantships are calculated into the GPA. All classes have equal weight.

**Advanced Placement Courses** offered: English Literature, English Language, Studio Art, U.S. History, European History, U.S. Government and Politics, Biology, French, Japanese, Spanish, Statistics, and Calculus. **Honors Courses** are offered in 9<sup>th</sup>/10<sup>th</sup> English and World Studies.

AMHS offers a quality **Fine and Performing Arts** education in: Instrumental, Symphonic, and Vocal Music, Acting, Visual Communications, Jewelry, and Drawing and Painting.

Many of our **Career and Technical Education** courses offer Industry Certification and/ or college credit through the Tech Prep articulation program. CTE programs offered are: Business and Marketing, Culinary Arts, Woodworking and Design, Visual Communications and Graphic Design, Drafting-Engineering Technology, Computer Systems Engineer, Sports Medicine, and Horticulture.

**Special Academic Programs** offered include ELL (English Language Learners) and Special Services for IEP students.
