# Gildo Rey Dress Code

Following are the dress code guidelines for students. While some of these guidelines may seem unnecessary for younger students, for the sake of consistency, they apply to all.

- Spandex clothing is not permitted at school.
- Bare midriff clothing is not permitted.
- Tank tops or tube tops are not permitted unless a shirt, blouse, or vest is worn over them.
- T-shirts, hats, badges, or other items of apparel which, by printed word, symbol, or display, promote alcohol, drugs, tobacco, sex, nudity, violence, gang behavior, or that disrupt the educational climate are prohibited.
- Hats are not to be worn in the building and must be removed before entering the building.
- Pants, shirts, or blouses must be free from holes and must not be revealing.
- Dress and/or appearance which constitutes a clear and present danger to student's health and/or safety or which causes interferences with work or creates a classroom or school disruption will not be permitted.
- The hem of all shorts, skirts, and dresses must fall below the fingertips when the arms are down along the sides of the body.

# Recess Expectations

- **WALK** on the blacktop--including in the covered play area.
- **SIT** when you go down the slide.
- Hockey Boxes are for hockey only.
- The bars are for crossing only. No flips or hanging from your feet.
- Go in one direction only on the monkey bars, the rings and the parallel bars.
- Play in front of the brick wall away from the classrooms.
- No playing near the big tree or near the fence. Stay out of the trees and bushes.

## Primary Recess Behavior

### Observe the Building Wide Rules

- We follow the **no touch rule** at recess.
- **WALK** on the blacktop in the courtyard.
- We call others only by their names.
- We do not play chase games.
- **SIT** when you go down the slide.
- Hockey Boxes are for hockey only.
- The bars are for crossing only. No flips or hanging from your feet.
- Play in front of the brick wall away from the classrooms. Stay in your assigned area, unless you have a pass (to bathroom, nurse, or office)

# Intermediate Recess Behavior

## Observe the building Wide Rules

- **Obey the no touch** rule at recess. No contact sports (including rough play during basketball). No chase games.
- Call others **only by their names**.
- **WALK** on the blacktop in the inner court area.
- Play in front of the brick wall away from the classrooms. Stay in your assigned area. You must have a pass to leave the playground (bathroom, nurse, office).
- Stay out of the trees and bushes.
- Hockey Boxes are for hockey only.
- The bars are for crossing only. No flips or hanging from your feet.

## Undercover Play Day

- The sawdust and grass area are out of bounds when it is raining. (The playground equipment is slippery)
- If you do not have a hood or hat, stay under cover.
- If you do have a hood or hat, you may play on the blacktop that is not covered.
- Do not stand under the water spouts, water running off the shed or slide in the puddles.
- Obey the playground teacher when she signals you to go undercover because it is raining harder.

# Assembly Expectations

The Gildo Rey staff has set the expectations that the students will be polite, quiet, and courteous at all assemblies. The following expectations are carefully taught and modeled for students and monitored by adults:

1. Students should enter the gym quietly in a single straight line.
2. Students are to sit on the gym floor, with legs crossed (unless inappropriate), and facing forward. (Fifth grade only will bring chairs to sit on. Fifth grade students are to hold the chair facing forward, with the back of the chair toward the student, and holding the seat with a hand on each side.)
3. Appropriate voice level for saying the flag salute and singing the school song will be practiced and modeled in the classroom and at the “practice” assembly.
4. Classrooms will leave their rooms to come to the assembly so they arrive on time. For an all school assembly, grades K through 2 will leave their rooms 10 minutes before the start of the assembly. Grade 3 & 4 will leave their rooms 6 minutes before the start of the assembly, and grade 5 will leave 3 minutes before the start of the assembly.
5. Students are to keep hands and feet to themselves.
6. Students are to go to the assembly with empty hands and pockets.
7. An adult walking to the center front of the gym will signal the start of the assembly.
8. Restroom and drinks should be taken care of before the assembly.
9. Classes will sit in their assigned areas and use assigned doors to enter and exit.
10. Students will remain seated until dismissed by the person in charge. Students will look to their teachers for the signal to stand.
11. Students show pleasure or appreciation non-verbally by:
  - a. Clapping
  - b. Silent clap (waving-giving a hand)

- c. Round of applause (clapping in a circle)
- d. Fire cracker
- e. Class competitions may be conducted with non-verbal signals such as floor or knee slap, snapping

## Assembly Behavior

- **Respond immediately to the Building Wide Signal.**
  - **I need your attention, please. Also the time out sign.**
- How to sit on the floor: legs crossed, hands still, quiet voices.
- No talking when an adult walks to the front.
- Stay seated and wait for instructions from the teacher when the assembly is finished.
- **Fifth** grade students can bring chairs when specified. Carry chairs with two hands, do not slide them.

# Exiting the Building

- **Every class leaves the building at 3:0 p.m. Do not leave early.**
- Separate students by car pickup, bus or parent pickup.
- Bus: Establish a route for students to take the bus, check out with the bus board teacher.
- Car Pickup: Wait quietly next to the fence in the parking lot.
- Bicycles: Third grade and up. You must have a helmet to bring a bike on campus.
- Families and older students should pick up students at parent pickup or car pickup. Not anywhere else.
