PLANS FOR 2015-16

Alpac is developing a new three-year school improvement plan. We are setting goals and creating action steps that will help all students be successful this year and throughout their whole academic career. This process begins by looking at current and historical data, identifying strengths and challenges. Next, we collect input from staff, students and families. With this information we create a viable plan which incorporates the new technology from the recently approved Technology Levy.

We recently adopted Second Step as our Social Emotional Learning and Anti-Bullying curriculum. This research-based curriculum teaches students skills in recognizing and managing emotions, having empathy, controlling impulses, communicating clearly, cooperation, responsibility and problem solving. The bullying component teaches students the three Rs, to **Recognize** bullying (intent is to harm, repeated behavior over time and an imbalance of power), to **Report** bullying and to **Refuse** to participate in bullying. We are looking forward to seeing the positive impact this will have at Alpac.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

Alpac is an award winning school with a dedicated and experienced staff. Alpac has been recognized with the Washington Achievement Award in 2011 and 2012, as well as being named a School of Distinction in 2011, 2012 and 2013.

This year we are rolling out 90 chromebooks and 60 tablets to bring technology into every classroom and to each student.

Alpac is a Learning Assistance Program (LAP) school. With special emphasis on reading literacy in grades K-4, schools use their state LAP funds to deliver supplemental services that give these students the strong start they need for academic success.

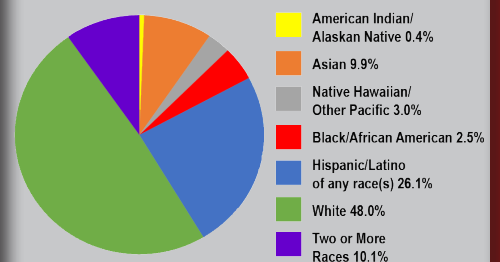

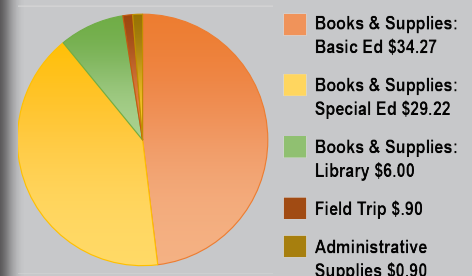

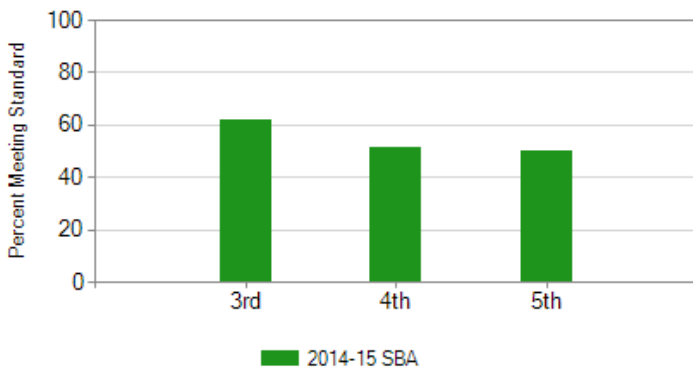


ALPAC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL 2014-15 BUDGET Funds Spent Per Student (not including salary)

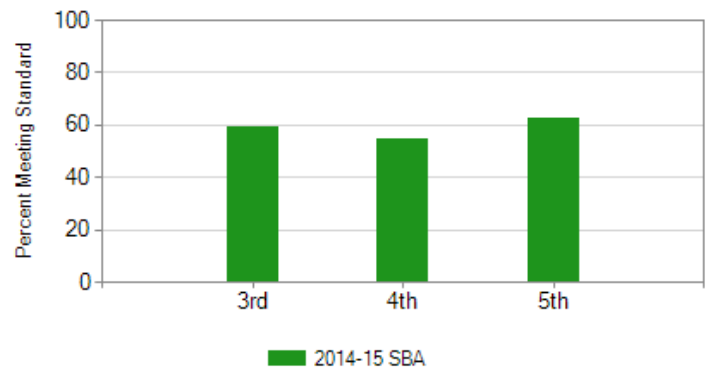
