As we look ahead, we know the new SBA testing is going to present challenges to our successful students. The exciting part is we have done this work before and now we look at where we are and what is working for our students and we can adjust/change to help our children be successful at this new level of learning.

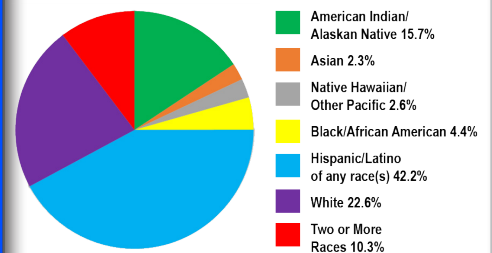

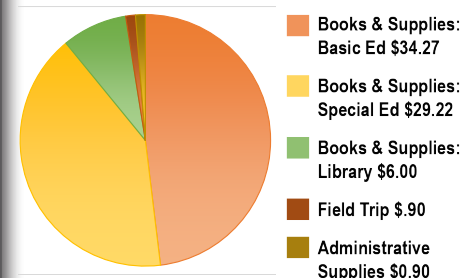

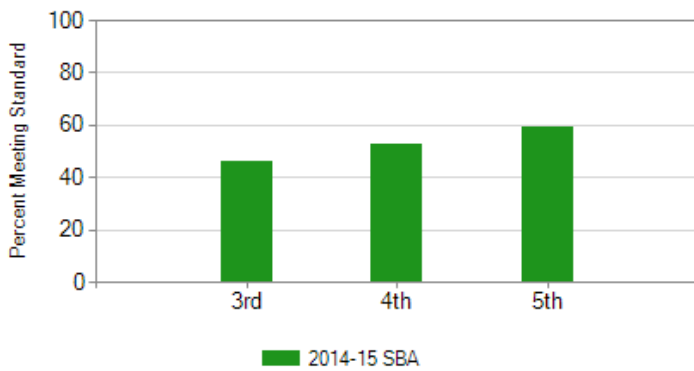


CHINOOK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL 2014-15 BUDGET Funds Spent Per Student (not including salary)

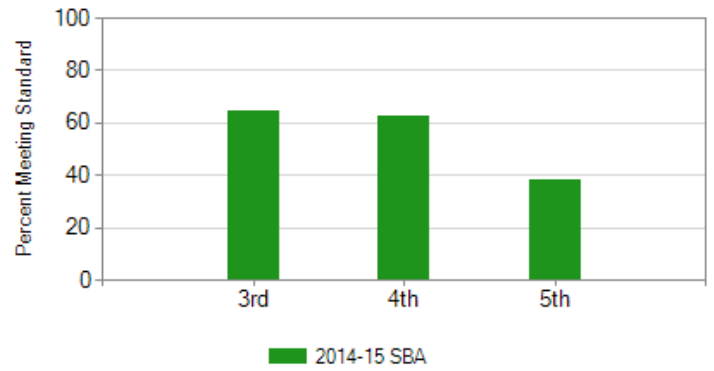
