PLANS FOR 2015-16

Ilalko Elementary School is developing a new three-year improvement plan this year to start in the 2016-17 school year. We are taking into consideration the changing demographics of Ilalko with the recent boundary changes as well as the changing standards of education. The School Improvement Executive Committee is made up of teachers, specialists, the principal and a parent.

Another focus at Ilalko is on student responsibility and anti-bullying, which includes the use of the Kelso plan and "Be Cool" for conflict resolution. Teachers continually re-teach expectations, playground rules and student responsibilities. The goal of school-wide responsibility and anti-bullying is to continue to make Ilalko a safe and positive learning place for all students. At Ilalko, students and staff care about one another.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

At Ilalko, we inspire students to become lifelong learners and productive citizens by teaming together to meet their needs through our school motto: "*Teaming together for our future.*"

As unique as its name, Ilalko is located in a rural setting just south of the White River. Named after a Native American village, the word "Ilalko" means "Striped Water." Ilalko opened in the fall of 1992 and serves students from kindergarten through grade five. The student population includes children from the city of Pacific and the southeastern section of Auburn. Once students complete their fifth grade year at Ilalko, they move up to Mt. Baker Middle School for sixth through eighth grade and go on to finish at Auburn Riverside High School for ninth through twelfth grade.

Ilalko welcomed Chromebooks to the school this year at the 3rd grade level as the building moves to a 1:1 technology goal.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

One of the strong forces behind the success of Ilalko is the PTA. Members of the PTA and other parent volunteers can be found at Ilalko on a daily basis helping with day-today activities and coordinating events such as the R.I.C.H. Reading program, Accelerated Reader, assemblies, Fall Family Night, Spring Carnival and other enjoyable family activities. The Ilalko PTA also has created a resource library for parents and teachers. The Ilalko PTA and ASB recently collaborated on the installation of an electronic reader board to keep families and the community informed about school and district events.

LAP PROGRAM

Ilalko is a Learning Assistance Program (LAP) school. LAP programs serve eligible students who need academic support for reading, writing and math, or who need readiness skills to learn these core subjects. With special emphasis on reading literacy in grades K-4, schools use their state LAP funds to deliver supplemental services that give these students the strong start they need for academic success.
