PLANS FOR 2015-16

West Auburn High School is successfully implementing a building wide Title I Program with a focus on formative assessment. Our plan aligns with our School Improvement Plan and every teacher is using Cornell notes making classroom expectations familiar across content areas. Teachers are using a consistent measure of student's progress and enriching their collaboration through our PLCs along with focused data review and professional development.

We have always used and supported technology in the classroom with our numerous educational applications. This year we have continued to expand our use of technology with building-wide Wi-Fi and additional Chromebooks available for every teacher to use ensuring every student has the tools they need in our rapidly changing global environment.

Our overall plans for West Auburn are to continue providing an individualized educational experience for all students focused on high school graduation.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

Between 250 and 300 students in grades 9 through 12 are served at West Auburn. Unique program options offer flexible learning environments for a diverse student population. Students are provided the opportunity to experience a quality education by participating in programs designed to support academic, physical, social and emotional well-being to experience successes in school. Extended hours and program variety affords students opportunities to maximize the number of earned credits and/or coordinate work and class hours when necessary.

West Auburn's individualized programs have evolved and continue to evolve to meet student and community needs. Students take a variety of courses for core requirements, electives, career and technology subjects. Although class requirements are stringent, students find the atmosphere at West Auburn to be relaxed, and staff members supportive of personal learning styles. The programs offered at West Auburn include: Day School (optional, seven-period day), Learning Center, Virginia Cross Native Education Center and the Virtual Program, which offers accredited on-line coursework.

In 2010 West Auburn received the award for overall improvement from the State of Washington and over the last five years our graduation rates have continued to increase.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Along with inviting families into our school for events including Open House and Student Led Conferences. West Auburn is involved in several community activities and partnerships. Students are encouraged to participate in Tech Prep and Running Start programs while at West Auburn. West Auburn maintains an active partnership with Auburn Youth Resources (AYR) to provide additional counseling resources for students. We also partner with local civic organizations including Rotary and the Auburn Food Bank. We also participate in the annual Auburn Clean Sweep event.

TITLE PROGRAM

West Auburn is a Schoolwide Title I school. This means all students at West Auburn are Title I students! Title I is a federally funded program developed to help schools raise the literacy and math levels of students. Teachers, parents and especially our students benefit from this unique status. As a Schoolwide Title I school, West Auburn is able to offer high quality instruction to ALL children. West Auburn students may receive extra support in reading, English language arts, science and math. We are working to improve student learning each year through partnership efforts between our staff, parents and students.


