### PLANS FOR 2016-17

During the 2015-16 school year, Evergreen Heights developed a three-year school improvement plan. We set goals and created action steps that will help each student master skills at their grade level and throughout their academic career. To create a viable schoolwide plan, we analyzed data and identified strengths and challenges. A portion of the plan focuses on technology and Chromebooks have been distributed to our student population to enhance their learning and build their technology skills. The school improvement process has been instrumental in our student achievement and academic success.

### HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

Evergreen Heights Elementary is a Washington School of Distinction award winner for the 2015-2016 school year. This is the third year we have accomplished this achievement. The Puget Sound Educational Service District recognizes schools that show sustained improvement over a five-year period in reading/English language arts (ELA), and math. Evergreen Heights was also recognized as a National Title I School of Distinction last December. This is the second time our school has been recognized as a National award winner for "closing the Achievement Gap" in mathematics. The success of our school is a result of hard work, high expectations and collaboration between staff, students, and parents.

### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Community and family engagement is extremely important for the success of student learning at our school. Evergreen Heights works in combination with the PTA to host monthly family nights including a fall festival, holiday shop, family game night, PJ's and Popcorn, a talent show and family dance. This includes regular skate nights at the Auburn Skate Connection. For the past four years, our school has partnered with the University of Washington to enhance professional development for our English Language Learners. We have also worked with many outside agencies such as Kiwanis, Rotary and Communities in Schools. All of these community programs support our students and their achievement.

### LAP PROGRAM

Evergreen Heights is a Learning Assistance Program (LAP) school. LAP programs serve eligible students who need academic support for reading, writing and math, or who need readiness skills to learn these core subjects. With special emphasis on reading literacy in grades K-4, schools use their state LAP funds to deliver supplemental services that give these students the strong start they need for academic success.

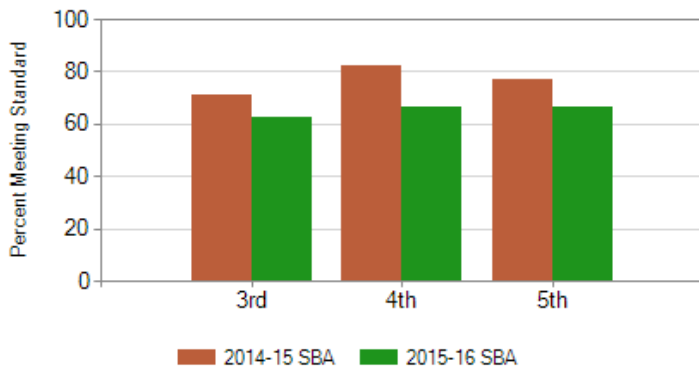

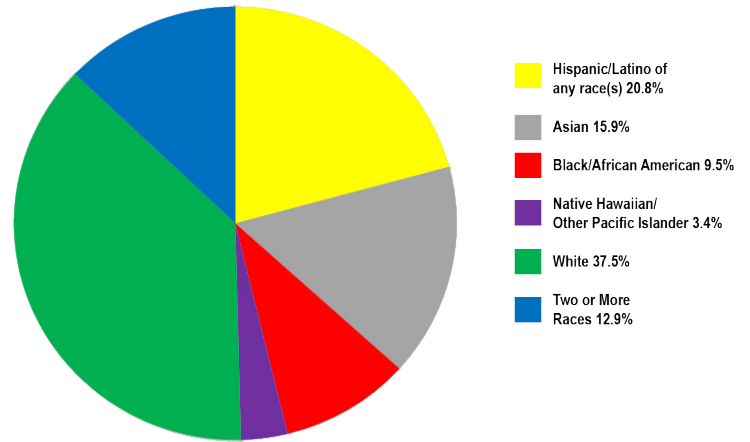

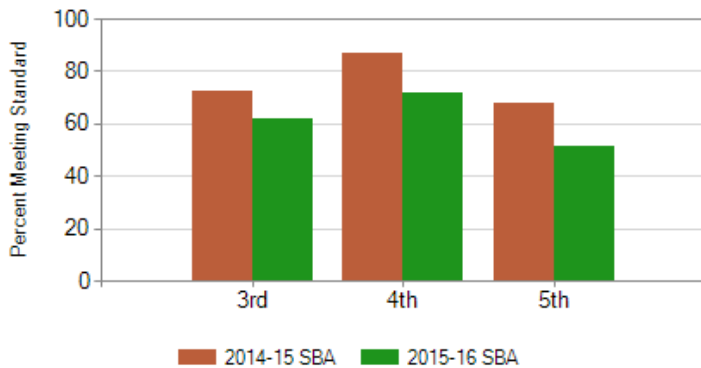
### ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS - Grades 3, 4 & 5



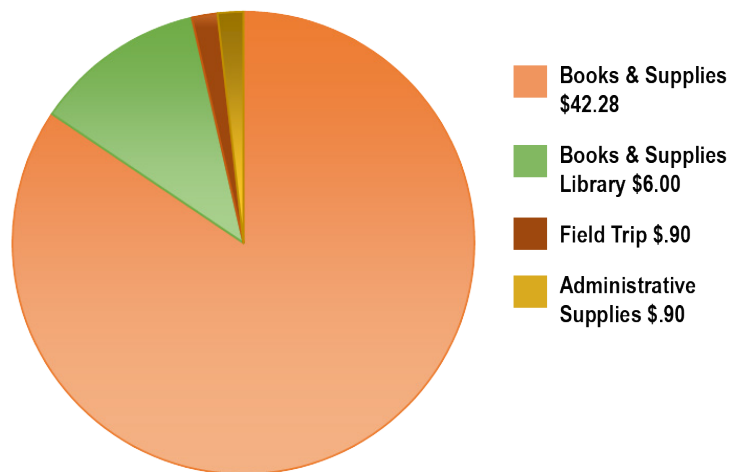
### OUR STUDENT COMMUNITY AT EVERGREEN HEIGHTS
