PLANS FOR 2016-17

A major focus for Lakeland Hills is continuous improvement in all areas of child development. This year we will continue to analyze data and make informed decisions about student progress. We will have Math and ELA goal setting conferences for students below benchmark and will continue to provide extended learning for those students. We will have two parent nights for Math and ELA that will focus on resources for use at home, a preview of the curriculum calendar so parents know what content will be taught and when, and at home support training. School staff will be developing a fully revised School Improvement Plan throughout this school year, which will be used to guide our work over the next three years.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Our PTA is second to none! We have a large PTA who helps raise money to support all of our programs at Lakeland Hills including:

Art Program; science fair; summer reading Olympics; Accelerated Reader; book fair; IXL Math; Reflections; STAR. They provide services to our students and families such as: WatchDOGS (a volunteer program for our fathers, uncles, grandfathers); a Giving Tree that support families in need; Pat-on-the-Back, a student recognition program. Our PTA organizes many social events for our families including: a school-wide carnival; father/daughter dance; Family Fun Nights (Mariner games, Sounders, Thunderbirds, movie nights) and organizes staff appreciation events throughout the year.

LAP PROGRAM

Lakeland Hills is a Learning Assistance Program (LAP) school. LAP programs serve eligible students who need academic support for reading, writing and math, or who need readiness skills to learn these core subjects. With special emphasis on reading literacy in grades K-4, schools use their state LAP funds to deliver supplemental services that give these students the strong start they need for academic success.






