The 2016-17 year brings exciting innovations and opportunities for us at Rainier Middle School. We are completing the third phase of our current strategic plan which had a heavy emphasis on reading comprehension skills in every content area. As we complete the third phase of the plan we are already working on revisions for the next three years.

As we move forward we are focused on how we can ensure equitable opportunities for all of our students. We are working to ensure that all students no matter their ethnicity, gender and language are never predictors of well a student will have the opportunity to succeed in a career, college or a trade school. The foundation we establish in middle school is vital to our children's success.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

Rainier Middle School is proud of the accomplishments of our students! As we work to e3nsure equity and access for our students we have expanded our master schedule to allow for more accelerated learning opportunities. We've more than tripled our accelerated course offerings over the last few years and we anticipate creating more opportunities over the next couple of years.

Students who need additional support receive help in a multi-tiered model that strengthens skills in reading and math. Personal development is important, too, and more than a 100 students participate in our leadership programs serving as leaders and mentors to their peers. Students provide orientation and mentoring to 6th grade students, plan and run assemblies, organize philanthropic events and charity drives, and plan specific activities to promote a positive and supportive environment at the school.

Our students also enjoy participating in a comprehensive award-winning after school sports program, thriving performing arts groups including drama, choir, orchestra and band. Approximately 80-90% of our student body participates in an after school program at least once during the year.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Rainier Middle School students thrive in the Auburn community and around the world. Students are actively engaged in our community supporting efforts such as clothing drives, Pennies for Patients, the Auburn Food Bank, the community Clean Sweep, serving at a local retirement home, tutoring elementary students, scouting, church service groups and more. 
