STUDENT WAIVERS

If you live outside the Terminal Park boundary area and your student is going to attend Terminal Park, you must have an approved waiver for the 2009-2010 school year. You may pick a waiver form up from the school office, the district office or online at auburn.wednet.edu/forms. Also, if you reside in a school district outside of Auburn, you must first get a release of attendance from that district and turn both in to our office.
