Senior Awards Night — June 7

The Senior Awards Evening will take place on Wednesday, June 7th at 6:30pm in the TAM. During this special event we will honor our seniors with academic achievements, special awards and scholarships.

Students <u>must</u> arrive by 5:30pm for rehearsal <u>no exceptions</u>.

Must wear graduation gown—no caps

Honor cords to be worn on graduation day will also be presented and include recognition for honor graduates with an accumulated GPA of 3.5—4.0 (silver cord.) Parents and family members are welcome and encouraged to attend this important and memorable event. If your student is going to receive an award, parents will receive a personal invitation. All senior class members are welcome to attend. Students receiving a white honor cord (3.2-3.49) please pick up in the Career Center during school.

<u>Tickets — June 8</u>

Each graduating senior will receive eight (8) admission tickets (no charge). Tickets will be released to graduates only (no exceptions) upon presentation of ID on Thursday, June 8th. Ticket distribution is based upon the district facility accommodations. Those graduates who need additional tickets may request up to two (2) extra at time of ticket pick-up. Extra tickets will be available on Tuesday, June 13th. We will do our best to accommodate requests, but cannot guarantee all tickets requested will be available. Seniors who remain in jeopardy of graduating will only receive tickets upon written verification from their counselors that graduation requirements have been met.

Senior Awards Assembly — June 12

The Senior Awards Assembly is on Monday, June 12th at 1:30pm in the gym. During this event we will honor our seniors with academic extracurricular achievements and special awards with the entire student body in attendance. Blue honor cords to be worn on graduation day will be presented for Department Excellence Students of the Year for both academic and citizenship categories. Parents are welcome to attend.

<u>Graduation Practice — June 16</u>

All graduates must report to the AMHS Main Gym on Friday, June 16th at 10:30am for graduation walk through. Students who miss this practice may lose their seat assignment and walking partner.

Graduation

Date: Saturday, June 17, 2023

Place: Auburn Memorial Stadium

Time: Ceremony begins at 9:30am

Graduates please be in the AMHS Main Gym by 7:30am for the final rehearsal. Please be prompt.

Auburn Memorial Stadium gates open to ticket holders at 8:15am. Please plan on arriving at the stadium by 9:00am to allow time for seating. Please note: Families arriving after 9:40am will be seated in Section J.

General Parking and Seating

Seating will be assigned by quadrant depending where your student is sitting. Please see the back of your ticket for your assignment. Parking is offered in the following areas: The large parking lot on 4th street by the baseball field, Administration Building parking lot, or on the streets in the area. Fourth Street NE will be closed to vehicles from 3rd Street to H Street from 8am to 6pm.

Handicapped Parking and Seating

Please request special handicapped seating passes in the Activities Office after June 1st. This special pass will not reserve you an individual seat, but will allow up to four (4) people to sit in a designated area for guests with special needs. Please plan on arriving early as this section quickly fills up. Other family members are expected to sit in general seating. Special parking is also available with this pass. You will be allowed to enter 4th Street to deliver disabled person(s) and park in the lot across from the pool, on a first come, first served basis until filled.

Camera/Video Recorders

Professional photographs will be taken of each graduate throughout the ceremony. These will be made available for purchase after commencement. Information on commencement photographs will be distributed to graduates when they pick up their tickets.

You may take pictures from your seat; however, no one will be allowed to take pictures in the aisles or near the walkway railings. No tripods will be permitted.

Senior Lineup

Seniors must be in the AMHS gym by 7:30am on the day of graduation for rehearsal. PLEASE BE PROMPT. Only graduates and faculty will be allowed in the gym. Graduates must have their caps, gowns, and tassels in their hands prior to entering the gym. Do not bring any other items into the gym.

After rehearsal, students will take school buses down to Auburn Memorial stadium for the ceremony and will be released to party in the street with their families immediately after graduation. Please discuss a rendezvous point with your graduate to meet up after the ceremony. Buses will be available for students needing to come back to AMHS, or students can ride home with family and friends.

Appropriate Attire

All graduating seniors will wear official caps with tassels, gowns, and stoles along with AMHS issued cords and/or medallions for commencement exercises. Culturally appropriate stoles and headcoverings are permitted. If you have not yet ordered your cap and gown, contact Jostens at www.jostens.com or call 206-931-4723 immediately. In addition to caps, gowns, and stoles graduates are expected to dress appropriately for a ceremony of this nature.

<u>Guidelines</u>: Sportscoats and jackets should not be worn under the robe. Sunglasses will not be permitted. A low hairstyle, so the mortarboard will fit properly, is recommended. Flat-heeled shoes are recommended. Please, no flip-flop style sandals (beach shoes). Students are welcome to decorate their graduation caps with school appropriate messages and decorations.

Diploma Pick Up

Diplomas will be available for pick up beginning Monday, July 10th between 8:00am-2:00pm at the bookkeeper's office. You will be unable to get your diploma if you have unpaid fines/fees, owe Thursday Night School, or have not earned the required credits for graduation. If not picked up by August 31, 2023, your diploma will be mailed to your home address on file.

Report cards and immunization records will be mailed to you at your last reported address. Please contact the guidance office if your address has changed and you have not reported that change.

Code of Conduct During Commencement

Only appropriate behavior will be accepted. Graduation is a traditional ceremony holding dignity for all; including participants, parents, and guests.

Audience

Please arrive with plenty of time to be seated prior to the 9:30am start of the commencement exercises. The gates on the Home Side will close at 9:40am.

Please note: Commencement begins as the graduates cross the field. Guests arriving after the ceremony begins will be seated in section J on the Visitor's side of the stadium.

All guests must remain seated until the entire program is completed. Balloons will not be permitted in the seating area as they obstruct the view of others. Cell phones must be turned off. Strollers, bullhorns, air horns, and other noise makers are not allowed in the stadium.

Please withhold applause during the diploma presentation since shouting, cheering, and applauding as an individual crosses the stage can cause the next graduate's name not to be heard by the audience.

Students

Alcohol and/or tobacco use is not permitted and any student who is found to have been using alcohol or other drugs will not be allowed to participate in the ceremonies. The use of alcohol, tobacco, or other drugs are strictly forbidden at any school district event.

Students will not be allowed to make inappropriate comments or gestures when they receive their diplomas.

Inappropriate behaviors will require completed community service hours prior to diploma being released.

Senior Grad Night 2023 (Non-district event)

What: Grad Night is an overnight graduation party. A once in a lifetime opportunity to celebrate your graduation with your class. Grad Night is planned by parents and put on for our graduating seniors. It's an all inclusive event and your ticket covers activities, entertainment, food, transportation to our secret locations as well as security and medical staff.

When: Saturday, June 17th leaving at approximately 9:00pm. Graduates will be transported by bus from AMHS and will return on Sunday, June 18th around 7:00am.

Where: Secret locations around the Puget Sound!

Why: Grad Night was started by parents who wanted to provide a safe way for seniors to celebrate their accomplishments in a safe environment; free of alcohol and drugs, on what is historically a dangerous night for our kids.

Cost: \$190 for tickets paid in full by April 20th and the price will increase to \$210 for tickets sold after that date or any tickets not paid in full by April 20th. Payments can be made via the Booster Club website via credit card or cash/check made out to AMHS Booster Club dropped off in the school office labeled for Grad Night/Booster Club and the senior's name.
