Parent-teacher Conferences

We hope that a parent/guardian will be able to attend a conference for each of our students on November 15, 16, or 17. Our partnership with you is very important. Throughout the school year we will teach the following Tiger Character Traits that are important for our students to develop: integrity, respect, compassion, responsibility, and perseverance. During November and December we are focusing on respect, which includes treating others the way you want to be treated, talk to others in a positive way, take time to understand someone who is different, use good manners and appropriate language, handle conflicts peacefully, be kind in words and actions. We hope you will ask your child about respect and how to apply this important character trait at school as well as outside of school. Respect is an important part of success in all areas and stages of life.

Volunteer Request

Terminal Park is eager to increase the amount of volunteers at our school. We specifically would like more volunteers for tutoring and recess. Students who need extra support with learning can benefit greatly from extra practice under the guidance of an adult. Our playground supervisors do a great job, but students benefit from increasing the amount of adults at recess, which could allow us to offer additional structured activities. Dress for the Weather

As we move into the time of year when the weather becomes consistently more wet and cold, please do your best to send your child to school with appropriate clothing (coats, hoods/hats, etc.). It is important for each student to stay warm and dry before school, at recess, and after school.

Lost and Found

Several items are added to our lost and found daily. Here are some actions you can take to help:

- Write your child's name on clothing tags with permanent marker.
- Remind your child not to leave coats on the playground.
- Teach your child how to tie a coat around his or her waist.

Dear parents/guardians,

If the time the teacher sets does not work with your schedule, please call the office to reschedule. <u>No conference changes will be</u> <u>made by the office after Monday, November 13</u>. After November 13, all conference changes must be made directly with the teacher.

Here are some helpful tips for a successful conference with your child's teacher:

Before the Conference

- Talk with your child about school: success, challenges, likes, dislikes, feelings, etc.
- Write down your questions/concerns about academic progress, behavior, peer relationships, attitude, struggles at home, etc.
- If needed, check to make sure we have scheduled an interpreter.

During the Conference

- Listen carefully and take notes for future reference.
- If you don't understand something, ask to have it explained.
- Ask for suggestions about what you can do at home to help your child.

After the Conference

- If your child didn't attend the conference, talk with your child about it.
- Let your child know you are proud and set goals together to improve.
- Follow through on suggestions you agreed to try to help your child.
- Continue to communicate with the teacher about progress, questions, and concerns.
