large scale earthquake drill at Lakeland Hills. During this time, phones will not be answered since our office staff will be participating in the drill. If you need to pick your child up from school during this

time, you may do so. We ask you to check your child out at our reunification tables, which will be located in the parking lot next to the gym. When we drill, we are not only preparing for an earthquake, we are preparing for any disaster.

Parent volunteers are still needed to help us walk through the reunification process (reuniting students with their families). **If you would like to participate, please email Mrs. Barlow or stop by her office** and she will give you further instructions. Your participation in the drill will allow you to learn the emergency procedures we have in place.

We are in the midst of a major mental/behavioral health crisis in Auburn and in our country with 1 in 5 adults and 1 in 5 teens experiencing mental health issues. We need immediate solutions to help our youth and adults.

The Auburn School District is leading the way by beginning with our students. In the 2019-2020 school year, teens in middle schools and high schools will have an opportunity to watch and discuss a 12-minute video produced by the City of Auburn – Teen R.E.A.D.Y.* (Real Emergency Aid Depends on You), the first step in increasing awareness of mental health issues in teens, reducing their fear of seeking help, and providing tools for teens to use in a crisis situation.

We invite our parents and community members to join us on November 13 for a facilitated discussion about the R.E.A.D.Y.* and Teen R.E.A.D.Y.* programs. On this night – in just one hour – you have the chance to join your teens on this critical journey – because help depends on all of us.
