Summer Safety Provided by AAA Washington



School is almost out for the summer and we are approaching our peak of 15 hours, 59 minutes, and 14 seconds of daylight hours and that means that school-age children are playing outside more, especially near parks and playgrounds. Young children get easily distracted with games and playing and may inadvertently dart out into the street on their bike, rollerblades, skateboard or chasing a toy.

Children under nine years old have a difficult time judging distances and speeds of cars and have a harder time than adults identifying where sounds are coming from. These facts make it more difficult for them to judge oncoming traffic and how much time they have to get out of the way of a moving vehicle.

We encourage all parents to teach their children how to behave around streets and moving vehicles. Here are a few basics to review:

1. Stop at the curb or street edge before entering the roadway.
2. Look in all directions before crossing the street.
3. Look for a long, safe gap in traffic to cross.
4. Look for turning vehicles.
5. Walk, never run, across the street.
6. Cross only at corners.
