School Board calls for a Citizen's Ad Hoc Committee & establishes the Committee's Charge (September 11, 2023)



Citizen's Facilities Ad Hoc Committee meets from September to December 2023



Recommendations presented to the School Board on January 22, 2024



School Board to consider administration's recommendation for future facilities (June 24, 2024)



Staff work to update costs to include escalation costs (March - May 2024)



School Board holds a workshop on March 11, 2024 to review reports and recommendations

Priority #1 Items recommended by the 2023 Facilities Ad Hoc Committee

- Complete Rank A and B improvements
- Build Middle School #5
- Replace Cascade Middle School
- Replace Alpac Elementary School



Complete Rank A and B Improvements

• <u>Scope</u>: Complete Rank A and B improvements except at replacement facilities. At replacement facilities complete Rank A safety, security, and critical system improvements only.

• Rationale:

- These improvements will address facility needs at 16 schools and 6 support facilities.
- Bond issue or Capital Levy funding is needed because the cost of improvements exceeds the resources available from the school district's operating funds.



Replace Cascade Middle School

<u>Scope</u>: Replace Cascade Middle School with an 800-student school at property located in the north end at I St. NE.
 Keep the existing Cascade Middle School facility after the replacement school is built on a new site for use as a future interim school and other school district operations.

• Rationale:

- Cascade Middle School is 57 years old, is in fair condition with building and site deficiencies, and currently has
 eight portable classrooms to address overcrowding. A replacement school will have more capacity and will be
 built to the school district's current design standards.
- Building a new Cascade Middle School at I St NE will:
 - Locate the replacement school in the vicinity of students who currently attend Cascade Middle School.
 - Allow construction of a school on a larger site with more space for a building, PE and athletic fields, student courtyard, and parking.
 - Allow students and staff to continue to use the existing school while a new school is built at I St. NE. This
 eliminates the need for an interim school while a new Cascade Middle School is built.



Replace Alpac Elementary School

Scope: Replace Alpac Elementary School with a 650-student school at its current site.

• <u>Rationale</u>:

- Alpac Elementary School is 52 years old, is in fair condition with building and site deficiencies, and currently has 8 portable classrooms to address overcrowding.
- A replacement school will have more capacity and will be built to the school district's current design standards.

• Comments:

- Alpac Elementary School cannot be replaced at its current site while the existing school is in use.
- Begin design work in June 2025 to allow an estimated school opening in 2028



Build Middle School #5

 Scope: Build a new 800-student middle school at the property located in the south end of the school district on Sumner-Tapps Highway E.

Rationale:

- The district needs a new middle school because middle school enrollment currently exceeds capacity by over 900 students.
- Its location in the south end will:
 - Reduce overcrowding at Mt. Baker and Olympic Middle Schools.
 - Allows middle school boundary adjustments that will reduce overcrowding at Cascade and Rainier Middle Schools.
 - Provide additional middle school capacity in the south end to address new residential development that will occur at the Oak View and Diamond Valley Estate projects.
 - Provide additional middle school capacity needed when a large residential development in the south end is built by Segale Corporation.
 - Provide an option to use the new school as an interim school for Alpac Elementary School.


