## **Education Planning Guide for Middle School and Beyond**

This program of study, along with other career planning materials, serves as a guide to assist students in the Auburn School District in developing a relevant middle-to-high school plan that will prepare them for further education and/or employment in the Education and Training career cluster. The program of study outlined below can be individualized to meet each learner's education and career goals. It allows students to earn high school credits while completing coursework in middle school, earn college credits while completing coursework within high school, and apply those credits toward attainment of a college certificate and/or degree. 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The Education and Training program provides exploration and preparation for careers in education and service to children. Students will develop skills in communication, organization and leadership, as well as a solid understanding of learning theories and styles, teaching methods, child development, lesson planning, and classroom management techniques. Students apply their knowledge and skills through off-campus internships as one-on-one tutors or classroom assistants in local elementary and junior high schools.
