#### It Takes a Team

- COVID-19 Site Supervisor- Designate a back-up or Co-Supervisor
- School Nurse-Screening Lead
- Custodian-Cleaning Lead

### The Link that Holds it Together



- Provide resources and information about COVID-19 to staff, students, and families.
- Gather information about close contacts and notify staff members if exposed to a confirmed COVID-19 individual.
- Help determine isolation/quarantine period. Refer staff to Human Resources for leave information.
- Communicate with custodial staff for disinfecting when required.
- Manages external and internal communication regarding outbreak status. Serves as a liaison to District COVID-19 Supervisor.

#### Monitor Masks or Cloth Face Coverings

•Make sure masks are available for all staff, students, and visitors.

- •Make sure staff and students are wearing cloth coverings/mask correctly.

#### Symptoms of Coronavirus (COVID-19)

#### Know the symptoms of COVID-19, which can include the following:



Cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing



Fever or chills



Stay Home With Any New Symptoms

#### Daily Wellness Checks

- Ensures all staff complete the mandatory daily wellness check within 30 minutes of arrival.
- Visitors complete paper wellness check upon arrival, includes substitutes and student teachers.
- Skyward-Human Resources-Employee-Wellness Check
- Blank, Green or Red

# Building Nurse-Screening Lead

Failed Response needs follow up-Building Nurse can provide support by;

- Answering questions you might have.
- Help collect information about symptoms, test results, or potential exposure to others in the building.

- Help with building contact tracing.
- Determine how long someone needs to quarantine if exposed to confirmed COVID-19 individual, or isolate if they test positive for COVID.
- Communicate information to the District COVID-19 Supervisor.

# What Information to Gather?

- Were you exposed to someone COVID-19 positive?
- If yes, who?
- When were they last at school?
- When did they start experiencing symptoms?
- What symptoms are they experiencing?
- What rooms did the person visit?
- Who did they have close contact with?
- What is their personal contact information? Birth date. Health Department request.

#### Close Contact Definition

Anyone who has been within 6 feet of a person with confirmed COVID-19 for at least 15 minutes cumulative within a 24-hour period.

(> 15 minutes and < 6 feet of separation)

Direct contact with body secretions, someone kissed you, coughed or sneezed on you, or you shared utensils.

Use of a mask or shield by COVID-19 positive person does not change the close contact definition.

(CDC and SKCPH)

What about a person exposed to a staff or student with **COVID-**19 like symptoms?

You can still come to work.

Monitor yourself for symptoms of COVID-19. **If you develop symptoms then stay home**.

If the symptomatic person later tests positive you quarantine.

Quarantine for 14 days, starting from the last day of close contact with COVID positive person.

Seek testing for COVID-19.

If you are tested for COVID-19 and test negative, <u>you must still quarantine for the</u> <u>full 14 days.</u>

### Positive COVID-19 Test OR Symptoms and Not Tested

#### If a Positive COVID-19 test-

- Student or staff must stay home at least 10 days from the start of symptoms,
- and be fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication,
- and an improvement of symptoms.

If close contact with a confirmed COVID-19 individual, and are having symptoms, but are not tested-

- Student or staff must stay home for at least 10 days from the start of symptoms,
- and fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication,
- and an improvement of symptoms.

# Symptoms and Not Exposed to Confirmed COVID-19

- Encourage follow up with Health Care Provider, especially if symptoms worsen.
- If NOT tested for COVID-19-remain home at least 10 days after the onset of symptoms
- and until fever free for 24 hours,
- and improvement of symptoms

Symptom and No Known Exposure/ Negative Test.

#### If No known exposure or a test **NEGATIVE** For COVID-19

- Can return 24 hours after fever has resolved,
- and symptoms have improved.
- OR
- With an alternative diagnosis from a healthcare provider you may return to work or school by following the guidance specific to your diagnosis.

#### Confidential but...

• Every employer should require every employee to disclose to the employer if they test positive for COVID-19 or have had close contact with someone who tested positive (and those employees should work from home and not be allowed to enter the building until medically cleared).

#### Separation Room (AKA Isolation Room)

- If a student or staff member develop symptoms of COVID-19 at school separate them from others until they go home. The ill person should continue to wear a mask, preferably an FDA surgical mask.
- Supervise from 6 feet.
- Consider rooms with window for ventilation.
- Consider having a cot as student may feel too ill to sit in a chair.
- Clean, disinfect and ventilate when the room is empty-completed by the custodian prior to re-using.

# Custodian-Infection Control

- Knowledge of cleaning and disinfecting plan.
- Initiates cleaning and disinfection of all affected areas.
- Assures that affected areas are not used until cleaning is complete.
- Assures COVID separation area is disinfected.
- Monitors ventilation of spaces.
- Provides correct cleaning supplies to staff.
- Helps determine face shield sanitizing area for staff.

### Cleaning and Disinfection Continued

- NO extra cleaning is required if a staff or student is sent home with symptoms of COVID-19.
- If student or staff report a positive COVID-19 test contact Geoff Lawson.
- Geoff will determine what extra cleaning/sanitizing/disinfecting needs to be done based on the exposure history. COVID Response Team may be required to go to a building for extra cleaning.
