The 3-period day is, in part, driven by needs to minimize movement at secondary schools. We are making plans to manage traffic and lunch to support distancing and safety.
I read that some classes will not be available in-person at the secondary level. Will choir be a class that is available in person or only in the distance learning model?	Choir will most likely continue in distance learning, based on the DOH guidelines.
Will the students be wearing cloth masks all day while at desks or will face shields or plastic dividers be used at desk	Cloth masks.

My daughter was moved to lilako from Alpac 5th grade due to boundary changes. She has anxiety and this change was extremely hard on her. What choice would be best for her to keep her teacher and class that she's finally feeling comfortable with. I really don't know which choice to make. please help	I am sorry for the disruptions. We know this isn't easy. Unfortunately, we just don't know until we have the information from our families and our staff.
Will the preK ECE be a full-day on the in-school days, or only partial days like prior school years?	I apologize you haven't received a response. We are working to run ECEAP as close to normal as possible. Exact schedules are still being designed.
So if there is a medical reason a child can't wear a mask or if they won't because of sensory issues they have to choose the distance learning option only?	If a student has a disability that prevents them from wearing a mask successfully, the school team will work with the family/student to determine the best option. We will need to address each situation individually.
For the students who have to quarantine, how does the remote learning ensure that the student is on pace with the rest of their class?	If quarantined, students will participate in Distance Learning.
In the hybrid model will it be a full day or part day like now with the Am and Afternoon sections for 1st grade?	In hybrid, students will attend all day, but the hours might be slightly adjusted. We are not doing half-day.
What if our child has an IEP and needs to stay with the teacher they have now? How are we supposed to make that decision if we dont have all the information we need?	In most cases. We may have some teachers who will be working remotely only, in those cases we will need to make some adjustments to teacher assignments between distance learning and hybrid.
Will our SLC children still have the same teacher when going to Hybrid learning?	In most cases. We may have some teachers who will be working remotely only, in those cases we will need to make some adjustments to teacher assignments between distance learning and hybrid.
How much parental support is anticipated for the 2 days of independent learning for the Hybrid model? The full time online model currently has minimal support necessary because a teacher is present for most of the day.	It depends on the grade level and probably the day of the week. We have not defined a particular number of hours.
If Auburn SD has a larger rate of infection than King or Pierce County, shouldn't that be the metric we are looking at rather than county numbers?	It is one of the metrics.
What is the maximum limit of students per class?	It will differ by classroom based on the space. At elementary, we are thinking about 12-14.

What are the repercussions to students that do not wear a mask? That don't have the ability to keep it on? Don't wear it properly? etc.	Masks are required for health and safety reasons, like immunizations. Students must have immunizations to attend school. If students do not meet health requirements, they cannot attend. It is not discipline, like a suspension, but students cannot attend for the health and safety of all staff and students.
All about the little kids whom have many many years of education ahead of them! Should be same across all grades! Not singling out certain students. Not right or fair!	My heart goes out to our older students. We are working to return all grades within the guidance of the health department.
Can you explain the difference between a KN95 mask and an N95 mask?	N95 masks must be fitted and are reserved for those in the medical field. KN95 do not require fitting.
Will there be clear shield partitions for each student's table?	No
will the students have 2 different teachers? one for online (mondays) one for in-person?	No, elementary students will have one teacher.
If student choose to do distance learning will it only be PM?	No, it will be a full day.
Okay, so even though my son has an IEP, he won't be allowed to attend then if he refuses to wear a mask?	No, that is not the case. Please work with his IEP manager.
Are face shields acceptable instead of a cloth mask?	No, they are not. Cloth face coverings will be required.
Are you requiring all students be COVID tested?	No.
If I choose to do the hybrid learning, will my child be able to attend distance learning with his teacher when he doesn't attend in person learning?	No.
Will each school also have a meeting for more specific information?	No.
Will students who have an exception to wearing a mask be allowed to be in a classroom with other students wearing a mask?	No.
A lot of my friends are seeking clarification. When kids are on their remote learning days, they are simply watching the teacher from the computer the "same" as if they are in person, correct? It is not instruction in person 2 days and then independent/distance learning all day/no instruction on their remote days, correct? How can the teacher teach in class and monitor the on-line kids?	No. Students are not watching the teacher/classroom in streaming on distance learning days. They will be completing independent and online work as set up by the teacher.

Once we know what each STEP family decides then we will place the three STEP teachers with the STEP students to reflect the families' choices. So, if 1/3 choose Distance Learning then we would have 1 teacher do STEP Distance Learning and the two would to the Hybrid program. We'll know once we have families' preference.
With every class the number of student in class are 20+. How can you distance the kids? Also with them coming back to school excited to see friends, how is that going to happen?	Only half of the students will be there each day due to the ABAB schedule.
How will these questions be asked of a 5 or 6 year old?	Parents will be doing the daily wellness screening. We also will be taking temperatures.

Students in quarantine will switch to distance learning if well enough to do the schoolwork.
Will students of the PM program have the same access to a teacher as those in a day-time distance learning program?	Students in the PM Program are assigned a teacher much like the day distance program, but their virtual face-to-face time occurs evenings, 4:30 - 7:30.
Students, English as second language, how are they taught if they want to stay in the full distance learning prgram	Students who stay in full distance learning will likely recieve support from EL staff similiar to the way they are supported currently.
I see that kids will also be provided a microfiber cloth. Is this for them to clean their areas daily with envirox? In reading the SDS, there is a requirement for the cleaner to wear gloves when handling this chemical, even when diluted, will they be provided this protection during cleaning? thanks!	Students will clean their desks with cleanser that is safe to use.
Can you please clarify what the teacher directed learning will look like on days that are not in-person? Will children log-in to a virtual class like they are doing now or will they be sent home with a list of activities to complete on their own for their non-school day?	Students will not have virtual meetings with their teachers. They will have activities to complete as directed by their teachers - these may be online in Seesaw or Classroom, or may be offline activities sent by teachers.
I do NOT want my child to change teachers. Will we be forewarned that changing to the hybrid model will result in new teacher? At what point woud we be informed? This is a factor that I need to take into account	Teacher changes will not depend on which model is chosen. Staff health needs also need to be incorporated into our planning.
I think I heard you say that teachers will e using their planning time to teach online classes. Has the union accepted that? That is surprising	Teachers will still have planning time. It will not be during the class periods. Currently, our secondary teachers all have planning at the same time in the morning.
I would like to receive more communication from the superintendent of what's going on. Bi-weekly updates would be nice.	Thank you for the feedback.

I assure you we are working to bring students back in person. In reality, the virus sets the timeline. But we will do everything we can. Given the data, a month is not likely, and it will take extra time to return middle and high school.</p>
<p>It still has not been communicated well, what happens when a secondary student tests positive? How do you send a "class" online when they have three classes. Will you shut down the entire secondary school?</p>	<p>Thank you. I understand your question now. We will come up with a clear answer for you. They would need to stay home, and we would need to provide online learning for all 3 classes.</p>
<p>That didn't answer my question. Before they were not testing asymptomatic people. If they are now widely testing this group as well, which have shown to be much higher than they original though, then of course the positive numbers are going to go up.</p>	<p>Thank you. We are following the expertise of the health department. Their guidance is that asymptomatic cases can still transmit the virus.</p>

Yes, we are asking students to clean their desk with a microfiber cloth. Teachers will supervise to ensure proper cleaning of student desks.</p>
<p>What training does the COVID coordinator have?</p>	<p>The district lead nurse/health administrator is training per DOH guidelines.</p>

Ventilation systems will be running at “their” optimum level or at an optimum level?	The systems are running at the optimum level they are to be running at.
Do we know hat the start time differences will be between the Elemetaries for childcare to drop off students at both?	The time between early and late elementary school is 40min
Just to verify we are at 7.4% and we need to be less than 5% to be in the moderate category correct? Then the hybrid model can be implemented.	There are a number of metrics we are looking at, including rates per 100,000 in King and Pierce counties and in Auburn, as well as test positivity.
If your plan is to expel my kindergartener because he can't keep his mask on during this Hybrid theory, then that's going to significantly weigh into my decision - Same for my 2nd grader.	There are districts to the south of us who have brought back the youngest learners and they are not having any problems with kids wearing masks.

Will PM students have access to specialists like day-time distance learning students?	They do not currently. We are exploring if we can do this asynchronously as we transition.
In regards to secondary schools, will the desks be placed 6 feet apart in classrooms or will they remain at the same regular distance?	They will be 6 feet apart.
Will new students be placed in distance learning only since they would be new to a cohort if doing in person learning, or will they have a choice just as we do now for current students?	They will have a choice, just like any new student.
How will teachers be able to teach in person and on line at the same time?	They will not be doing both.
Will the techers who are doing hybrid only have Tues/Thur or Wed/Fri group, or will they be working with both cohorts on the different days?	They will work with both groups--their whole class.
My child is a 3rd grader in a 2nd/3rd split class; if we select the hybrid model will they return to school in the first wave with K-2?	Third graders would return in the second wave.
My concern is the mental health of these kids. I have a freshman who is struggling and broke down the other day because he really wants to be in school. I know we are in a pandemic but are other aspects being looked at as far as how this is affecting their mental health??	This is on our hearts and minds as well. Please reach out to your school counselor who is ready to help.

How is this being considered when looking at returning to school part time?	This is one reason we are really watching the trends. We do not want to open and close schools.
Will the teachers assigned to distance learning come from the student's assigned school or will they be in a district-wide pool?	This is part of the puzzle. We need to see what our staff resources are to meet the needs of our families. It will depend on numbers.
When will the issue of the crazy attack squirrels be addressed?	This made us laugh. So we left it in for everyone to see.
How will ASB address kids who have kids in daycare in a different geopgraphic location?	This will be addressed on a case by case basis.

I have kindergartens twins same teacher. would the be in class together or separate days	Together.
Many grade levels all share one hallway and one bathroom. Are teachers going to have to coordinate sending students to the bathroom? Will an adult be there to monitor and make sure students stay socially distanced in the bathroom? etc?	Transitioning through the schools will be coordinated to minimize risk for students.
So if my child is in a PM program can they attend school during the day 2 days a week and still attend their current PM class the other 3 days?	Unfortunately, no. PM program will only be available for distance learning, not hybrid.
If we chose distance learning, will our children stay with their hybrid class and teacher but online?	Unfortunately, there will be a lot of schedule changes as we accommodate both family and staff needs. We cannot guarantee anyone will stay with the teacher they currently have.
is the school campus going to be free from political signs and statements, including black lives matter?	Unless political symbols or signs are relevant to the instructional program, they should not be displayed.
For high school, if my kids do the hybrid plan and return to school, what will the schedule be? Will we still be on a 4 quarter system? Will the kids keep their same schedule/classes. If we choose to keep doing virtual school, will everything with their schedule and classes remain the same with the same teachers?	We anticipate staying on the quarter system. It works best should it be necessary to revert back to distance learning.
If we hold the kids back from the hybrid plan for now, and continue with distance learning, will there be another opportunity in the year to join up with the hybrid option?	We are asking families to commit through January. We will look at all of the metrics again as January approaches to see if we can make adjustments.
Early in the meeting you showed numbers for Pierce and King county along with AD numbers. Will the decision made be based on the AD numbers or the county numbers?	We are considering all of these data points.
Dear Auburn SD. I will make this simple for you. Too many cases of COVID means keep kids home and safe for now. Look at the numbers. Also...if you are feeling so safe out there, then why are you on Zoom?	We are following the DOH guidelines of not having large gatherings. We are watching the data and will not bring students back until we are firmly in the moderate range. We do not have a date for returning.
Why are other schools in other counties returning earlier and how are we leveraging their process and learnings?	We are in close contact with surrounding districts to learn from them.
Are you guys taking into account that they are now mass testing (right here in auburn) and they are encouraging asymptomatic people to test? Obviously the test numbers are going to go up when you do this.	We are looking at the positive case numbers, not just the number tested.
With the kids coming in are you going to be testing them for covid?	We are not doing COVID testing.
how many hours they could possibly they will stay in school? for an instance, a kindergarten. thank you	We are planning for the two student in-school days to be for the full day
How will recess look while staying 6 ft apart?	We are still working on recess details.
Will students be walking in a line to lunch and recess and buses? Will they maintain a 6ft between for the line?	We are still working on the details for lunch and recess.

Who will provide the wellness checks w/in the schools? How long will health checks take each day? How will employees keep students under 8 years in masks on each day?	We are still working out all of the details. Families will be part of the process to make sure sick kids are staying home. With half of the students there each day, we aren't anticipating that it takes a lot of time. Districts to the south of us who have brought their youngest learners back are reporting great success in young students wearing masks.
I am not sure how realistic that is to ask someone to go online and fill out the form every morning before getting on the bus or being dropped off.	We are thinking that, too. All staff use the skyward wellness screening. We have a committee developing options for students--for some the online system will work well; others may want a hardcopy form.
Do both Pierce and King county have to meet the state mandated metrics such as fewer than 75 cases per 100,000 over 14 days? Does Auburn follow both counties or just King County?	We are watching all of the data.
Federal Way School District is in King County. They have made the decision to wait until January to consider returning to school in order to prevent a false-start. Why can't Auburn do the same?	We are watching all of the data. We want to be ready to return to in-person instruction as soon as it is advisable.
Can you tell us what a typical day at school would look like?	We are working on this.
If you select the hybrid model, will schools still offer before and after programs thru the YMCA;etc.?	We are working with our childcare partners.
Will Right at School be available for before/after school care for those families that elect to do the hybrid model?	We are working with our childcare partners.
How do you clean shared activity equipment (musical instruments, PE equipment)?	We do not envision music and PE will be in-person. We believe those will continue to be provided in distance learning. Both are considered high-risk.
I would like to know what the model looks like for high school music students. Which teachers will be teaching hybrid which teacher will teach remote. With hybrid will students be allowed to practice?	We do not have the answer as to which teachers will be teaching hybrid.
are children going to be required to wear masks outside on the playground or during PE?	We don't anticipate them having PE in-person. It is considered a high risk activity. We are planning they would not need to have masks on at recess and they would keep their distance as much as possible.
Wow! You all have had to think about SO many details. First off, thank you! We are all in unfamiliar territory. I was wondering what happens when one person (kid or staff) at a school gets COVID? Whats the protocol? Does the school shut down to clean? Or what happens?	We have a detailed protocol to follow that the DOH has provided--each school/building has a Covid Coordinator who will direct the responses in communication with our Health team
What percent of students do you need to go hbrid? What is there is not enough?	We have not set a percentage, we need to know what our community wants and we will build the program to support it.
Will the daily online schedule (blocks, recess, lunch...) change for distance learning? I know what each teacher does in each block of time and such may vary, but in general will the schedule and start/end times change?	We hope to keep this very similar to current however some changes may be necessary based on family responses, program adjustments, etc.
As a follow up....we have accommodated a much later start/finish time to work with our daughters schedule for extra-curricular activities. How can we make a choice amongst the options by the deadline without knowing the details?	We just don't have all of the details worked out yet. Please submit your best thinking at this time.

schedules: Why the split days? Why not have it be Tuesday/Wednesday and then Thursday/Friday?	We looked at that model. Instructionally, we decided having 5 days between in-person days was too much.
Have you considered only going half days, especially for our younger students?	We looked at this model and going 2 half days just wasn't logistically feasible. Also, the AM/PM model doesn't work due to transportation.
I have a preschooler who struggles with wearing a mask. What if it's not working for him to be doing in-person school? Can we switch back to online?	We need families to commit through January. We need to staff both programs and it won't be easy to go between the programs.
If we are in the HIGH range why are we being rushed to decide on what model to commit to?	We need to be able to plan so we are ready when it is safe to return. We need to know what our families want and what our staff resources are.
If there is not a foreseen hybrid date then why the requirement to commit to one decision or the other until January? Does that mean we're leaning towards returning before January? That makes a big difference in my choice.	We need to be ready if the data indicates we can return. We need information from families and staff to build the program.
Overall, how conservative are you being in your approach to the numbers that you use in the range of numbers that DOH is given. For example, the high end is 75, but it doesn't seem to be wise to start there....Not asking for a number, just a philosophy...	We need to be securely in the moderate range. We haven't specified an exact amount of time yet and the infection rates need to continue to be trending down.
what happens if we decline to select an option?	We need to hear from all of our families and will follow up.
What if commitments through January not be made at this time due to too many unknowns?	We need to know what our community wants so we can build the programs. Please submit your best thinking.
For those of us with ECE students that struggle with proprioception (knowing their body and physical space), would it be preferred to go with the distance learning? Many of the special needs students do not know how to maintain a 6 foot distance, but can't possibly learn how without being around others.	We totally understand this reality, which is one reason we are keeping the groups small and in cohorts. We encourage parents to make the decision that is right for each of you, your children, and your family.
Has Auburn considered the logistics within the school day, especially for younger children who need help putting on masks and washing their hands? Auburn school days are 6.5 hours each day. Much of the day seems to be waiting in a long - socially distanced- line to wash hands and wash their desks. How can Auburn justify putting children, teachers, and staff at risk by sending them to school when there isn't much time for students to learn while they are in a school setting?	We understand your concerns. We are asking families to choose the best option for their students. Some families want to return to in-person and some do not. That is why we are offering two options.
Will students be seated all day once in classroom or still have opportunities to move thier bodies?	We want to provide students with the opportunity to move around during the day.
