Starting October 1st, all seniors should go to https://fafsa.gov/ and complete their Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Washington State Scholarship Programs:

- The Washington State Opportunity
 Scholarship (WSOS) supports low- and middle-income students pursuing eligible high-demand majors in science, technology, engineering, math (STEM) or health care.
- Act Six Scholarship: Act Six is a leadership and full-tuition scholarship program that connects local faith-based community affiliates with faith- and social justice-based colleges
- Governor's Scholarship: The
 Washington State Governor's
 Scholarship for Foster Youth is a
 scholarship program that helps students
 in/from foster care continue their
 education and earn a college degree.
- <u>Leadership 1000 Scholarship:</u> The Leadership 1000 scholarship is for students attending a four-year college or university in Washington state and have at least a 2.75 high school GPA.

253 PLU Bound Full Tuition Scholarship - Rolling Application

PLU offers a scholarship for students who are College Bound eligible, attend a high school in Washington state, and have a 3.50 or better weighted cumulative GPA. Students who qualify will be awarded full tuition for their four years at PLU through a combination of federal, state, PLU grants and scholarships, and the College Bound Scholarship.

<u>Seattle Pacific University Falcon Bound Scholarship</u> - Rolling Application

Did you apply for Washington state's College Bound program while in middle school? If so, you may be eligible for the Falcon Bound Commitment — and have 100 percent of your SPU tuition covered over four years! Just apply for admission and submit your FAFSA to be automatically considered.

<u>Auburn Community Scholarship</u> - Deadline March 25, 2022

The Auburn community gives over \$50,000 each year to ASD graduates to pursue additional training or education after high school. The Cirkled In "No Sweat" Scholarship is a \$2,500 scholarship grant to one outstanding high school student. This quarterly scholarship is easy to apply-No GPA requirements, no minimum income requirements and no essay to write.

Home Depot Foundation's Path to Pro Scholarship - December 31, 2021

The Home Depot Foundation works to improve the homes and lives of U.S. veterans, train skilled tradespeople to fill the labor gap and support communities impacted by natural disasters. The Foundation has pledged to invest \$50 million in training the next generation of skilled trades people and bringing the opportunity gap through its Path to Pro program. For high school students focused on Carpentry, Electrical, HVAC, Plumbing or Construction Management.

DECA Student Scholarships - January 4, 2022

DECA's scholarship program provides over \$200,000 in scholarships to high school and college DECA members at the International Career Development Conference (ICDC) each year. Many corporate partners of DECA provide scholarships through the DECA scholarship program. DECA Inc. administers the program based on guidelines set by the donor. DECA scholarships are strictly merit-based.

Note: You must be a current DECA member to be eligible for DECA Scholarships.

Ron Brown Scholar Program - January 9, 2022

The Ron Brown Scholar Program seeks to identify students who will make significant contributions to society. Applicants must excel academically, show exceptional leadership potential and make an impact on their communities through service to others. Each year, 45 students are designated Ron Brown Scholars and receive \$10,000 annually for four years, for a total of \$40,000. To be eligible, applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents, Black/African American and current high school seniors at the time of their application.

Terry Crews "Creative Courage" Scholarship - January 12, 2022

In an effort to continue to lift up those in need, the Terry Crews "Creative Courage" Scholarship is designed to create more opportunities for struggling artists chasing their dreams. One artist will receive \$20,000 to use toward their artistic development and education.

John F. Kennedy Profile in Courage Essay Contest - January 14, 2022

Contest Topic: Describe and analyze an act of political courage by a US elected official who served during or after 1917. All submissions must adhere to contest requirements.

Recognition and Awards: 1st place: \$10,000, 2nd place: \$3,000, Five finalists: \$1,000 and Eight semi-finalists: \$100 each.

Dr. Meme Heineman Scholarship - January 14, 2022

In memory of Dr. Meme Heineman, a driving force in the positive behavior support movement and leader in the field, this scholarship seeks to support students pursuing a degree in Psychology or Applied Behavior Analysis is encouraged to apply for this scholarship. In 1,000 words or less please tell us the reasons you believe you should be awarded this scholarship and the ways in which this scholarship will assist you to propel in the field of behavior analysis.

GSBA Fund & Pride Foundation Scholarship - January 14, 2022

GSBA awards educational scholarships to LGBTQ+ and cisgender/straight-ally students who are committed to making a difference in the world. Our scholarships range up to \$13,000 annually and are meant to provide significant support as you pursue your educational goals.

Mensa US Scholarship - January 15, 2022

The Mensa Foundation Scholarship Program awards more than \$175,000 in assistance every year to college bound students around the globe. Scholarships are awarded based solely on 550-word essays expressing applicants' academic and professional goals and how their personal experiences will help them to accomplish those goals.

WA State Fair Foundation-Blue Ribbon Scholarships - January 21, 2022

The Washington State Fair Foundation is pleased to present scholarship opportunities to high school seniors for continuing education. Students only need to submit one application for all the scholarships offered online. The application system will automatically apply students for the scholarships they qualify for.

Amazon Future Engineer Scholarship - January 25, 2022

At Amazon, supporting underserved students in their computer science education is not only important to us-it's imperative to building a diverse tech industry and future. Our Amazon Future Engineer Scholarship program provides students like you with an

APIASF (Asian & Pacific Islander American Scholarship Fund) January 26, 2022

This scholarship is open to seniors with Asian or Pacific Islander heritage. Awards range from \$2,500 to \$20,000.

Be of Asian and/or Pacific Islander ethnicity as defined by the U.S. Census

- Be a citizen, national, or legal permanent resident of the United States.
 Citizens of the Republic of the Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia and the Republic of Palau are also eligible to apply
- Be enrolling as an undergraduate student in a U.S. accredited college or university in the Fall of 2022.
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.7 on a 4.0 scale (unweighted) or have earned a GED
- Must apply for federal financial aid for the 2022-2023 academic year using the Free Application for the Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by early April 2022
- Submit one letter of recommendation online

Leadership 1000 Scholarship - January 31, 2022

The Leadership 1000 Scholarship awards funding to certain high school seniors attending eligible high schools and who are planning to enroll in a Washington state college or university. The scholarship is renewable and available in amounts up to \$5,000.00 per academic year. Scholars receive career and financial aid guidance as well as networking opportunities with CSF Alumni and scholarship donors to ensure they graduate with a college degree and achieve success in life.

BTL Athletes Scholarship - February 1, 2022

BTL Industries is all about strengthening and empowering individuals based on the values of teamwork, trust, and building others up. Student-athletes face unique challenges as they pursue their education, balancing the responsibilities of homework and studying with practices, training, and games for their sports. Eligibility Requirements: Must be a junior or senior in high school, Must be a varsity athlete or a student athlete and low-income.

Frank "Sam" & Betty Houston Post-Secondary Aviation Education Scholarship - February 2, 2022

This scholarship is for high school seniors planning to attend a college or university in science, engineering, or mathematics related to the field of aviation or aerospace. One student will receive a 4-year university scholarship up to \$30,000 annually for four years.

<u>Dr. Amanda Perez Scholarship</u> - February 15, 2022

The Dr. Amanda Perez Scholarship was developed in 2008 to assist high school and college freshman students who are interested in pursuing a career in medicine. Personal qualities, financial need, academic and extracurricular achievement will all be considered in the selection process. Must be a member of LMSA-WEST.

Women's University Club Foundation Scholarship - February 15, 2022

The Women's University Club of Seattle Foundation invites you to apply for one of five \$10,000 scholarships. Selection is based on a young woman's character, scholarship and achievements related to her school and community that are above and beyond requirements to graduate. *Applications are available online at* the WashBoard.org Login by searching Women's University Club of Seattle Foundation.

CollegeBoard Opportunity Scholarships - February 28, 2022

The scholarship program is open to juniors and seniors in high school, who meet all eligibility requirements.* There are a total of seven scholarships to be awarded. By completing each of the six college planning steps, students become eligible for the seventh **Complete Your Journey** scholarship. This program is open to students regardless of their family income. * See official rules for eligibility

Cascade Warbirds Aviation Scholarship- February, 28, 2022

One of the missions of Cascade Warbirds is to inspire today's young people to become the aviation pioneers of tomorrow. To give our flight-inspired youth a leg up on taking their first steps toward a career in aviation. This scholarship is available for students between the ages of 16 and 21 at the time of the award. It is valued at approximately \$1,350 and several awards are made each year.

American Indian Endowed Scholarship - March 1, 2022

The American Indian Endowed Scholarship (AIES) helps financially needy students with close social and cultural ties to an American Indian community in the state of Washington. Students can use the scholarship at public colleges and many independent colleges in Washington. Award amounts range from \$500 to \$2,000. Students may get AIES funding for up to five years, but they must reapply each year.

Robert J. Handy & WSSR Foundation Scholarship - March 1, 2022

The Washington State School Retirees' Association (WSSRA) invites high school seniors who have a GPA of 3.0 or higher to apply for the Robert J. Handy and WSSR Foundation scholarships. These awards are given to students who plan to have a career in the "field of education".

Gene Forrester Memorial Scholarship - March 1, 2022

WSSRA invites high school seniors who plan to major in Agricultural Education at Washington State University to apply for the (one time \$2,000) Gene Forrester Memorial Scholarship. Two (2) Gene Forrester Memorial Scholarships will be awarded.

Ewing C. Kelly Scholarship - March 10, 2022

The Kelly Foundation of Washington is pleased to offer the *Ewing C. Kelly Scholarship*. High school seniors in the state of Washington are eligible. Applicants will be judged on citizenship, academic achievement, and financial need. Each award is worth \$2,500 and winners will be notified in April. All applications (with ALL attachments) must be postmarked by March 10, 2021. (*Late or incomplete applications will not be judged*).

Horatio Alger Scholarship - March 15, 2022

As one of the nation's largest need-based college scholarship programs in the country, the Horatio Alger Scholarship Programs specifically assist high school students who have faced and overcome great obstacles in their young lives. While many programs are directed primarily to recognizing academic achievement or leadership potential, the Horatio Alger Association seeks students who have exhibited determination, integrity and perseverance in overcoming adversity, as well as have critical financial need.

Blacks at Microsoft (BAM) - March 31, 2022

The BAM Scholarship was created to enable Black and African American students to attend college and pursue a career in technology. The goal is to empower future generations to do more and be more. Your application must be submitted *online* by March 31, 2021 by 11:59pm Pacific Time.

Across Cultures No-Essay Scholarship - April 11, 2022

A \$1,350 scholarship for a student interested in learning about other cultures, and sharing their own. One student whose profile demonstrates an openness to learning about other cultures and sharing their own will receive help to continue on their path to travel and learn.

Don Barrows Memorial Scholarship - April 15, 2022

The Federal Way Chorale is offering to locally based high school seniors the opportunity to apply for the Don Barrows Memorial Scholarship. A \$2,000 award will be granted to the winner. Applicants must be a graduating senior from Federal Way or the surrounding area and planning a collegiate major or minor in vocal performance, musical theater or music education.

WiseGeek LGBTQ+Awareness Scholarship - April 16, 2022

The WiseGeek LGBTQ+Awareness Scholarship is a \$500 scholarship open to students that identify as part of the LGBTQ+ community. The WiseGeek LGBTQ+ Awareness Scholarship exists to support the dreams and aspirations of LGBTQ youth across the country.

WiseGeek Recent Immigrants Scholarship - April 16, 2022

The WiseGeek Recent Immigrants Scholarship is a \$500 scholarship for students who have immigrated to the United States on or after January 1, 2010. America is home to many immigrants who fuel our nation's growth and development. WiseGeek Recent Immigrants Scholarship will support a recent immigrant who has big aspirations for their future in the United States.

Nurse and Educator Dependent Commitment - Rolling Application

Gene Juarez Academy Scholarship - June 30, 2022

The Gene Juarez Academy Scholarship is available to 2021 high school seniors. \$1,000 awarded to Cosmetology program applicants. See the Gene Juarez scholarship page for additional scholarships and financial aid.

Rita's First-Gen Scholarship - July 1, 2022

This scholarship is open to any high school senior who will be a first-generation college student. Refugees are strongly encouraged to apply. The ideal candidate is a student who has experienced obstacles or sacrifice in pursuit of their education. These obstacles or sacrifices can be in the form of time, money, being away from family, having to care for or support one's family, completing school despite social, religious, familial, or cultural pressure, etc.

Women in Mathematic Scholarship - August 1, 2022

To be eligible for this scholarship, applicants must be enrolled in an undergraduate mathematics or related fields degree program at a 4-year, 2-year, vocational, or technical institution in the United States or a graduating high school senior who has plans to study mathematics or related fields. Applicants must also be a US citizen or a permanent legal resident.

Expand Your Horizons Scholarship - August 18, 2022

One student whose profile demonstrates an openness to learning about other cultures and sharing their own will receive \$2,000 to help them continue on their path to travel and learn. This may include studying new languages, traveling to study in a new place, teaching or learning art styles or cooking methods from a new culture.
