A letter from our Mayor about the Mental Health Crisis in Auburn:

This letter is a *special request* for your much needed support of a major mental health crisis in Auburn, which includes depression, anxiety, substance abuse and more.

Many people of all ages and walks of life are struggling with mental health issues, and a mental health crisis can happen to anyone.

- 1 in every 5 adults experience a mental health issue each year; as well as 1 in every 5 teenagers (ages 13-18); and 1 in every 6 students starting in elementary school (ages 6-17).
- An estimated 50% of all lifetime mental illness begins at age 14.
- The average delay between onset of mental illness symptoms and treatment is 11 years!
- Suicide is the second leading cause of death among people ages 10-14. (NAMI; CDC)

Auburn, according to the King County Community Health Needs Assessment, has one of the highest percentages of mental health issues in the state.

There is hope. Our Blue ribbon Committee (BRC), striving to make Auburn the healthiest city in Washington, developed and presented mental health videos to many city and state groups. **But more help is needed**.

In collaboration with the BRC, Wellpoint Washington (formerly Amerigroup), the Auburn School District (ASD) and the Auburn City Council passed a Resolution for Mental Health that challenges all residents of the city of Auburn to help fight this mental health crisis by watching one of the R.E.A.D.Y. (Real Emergency Aid Depends on You) videos: R.E.A.D.Y., TEEN R.E.A.D.Y., or R.E.A.D.Y. for KIDS (for parents of elementary school children). The videos are intended to increase our awareness of common mental health issues, reduce the stigmas around mental illness which often keep youth and adults from seeking help and equip residents with "tools" to use in case of a mental health crisis. This is one more step for Auburn to become the first city in Washington to actively engage all residents in the effort to address this crisis and create a better mental health life for children, teens and adults.

With the support and generosity of Wellpoint Washington, those watching a R.E.A.D.Y. video and reporting it become members, receive a gift and are placed in an exciting quarterly drawing.

One ASD parent said immediately after watching R.E.A.D.Y. for KIDS: "Thank you! This is amazing. Mental health is so important, and we have to be able to discuss it openly, removing the stigma surrounding the conversation. Appreciate the District's leadership in this space. If it helps one parent connect with their child more effectively, it's a win...and I know this video series will do so much more than that!"
