Message from Mr. Mac, Pioneer Principal

Pioneer Families,

Welcome to summer! On behalf of the staff at Pioneer, I want to express our appreciation for the support you provide your children and for partnering with us this school year. We are proud of our students, and have enjoyed working with them this year. Being able to observe their growth as learners and people over the past nine months has truly been a special opportunity for us.

As we head into the summer months, please encourage your child to keep learning and to stay active. Below are some recommendations for summer activities you can share with your child:

- Read Every Day
 - Have your child read for 30 minutes every day, or have someone read to your child. The Auburn Public Library is a short drive or walk, and has many wonderful reading options for students and families.
- Exercise Every Day
 - Play at a City of Auburn park, play at the Pioneer playground, go on a family walk, ride a bicycle, take a day hike, swim, get involved in summer sports activities through the Auburn Community Center, etc.
- Be Creative
 - Spend time building a fort, playing with Legos, drawing pictures, writing in a journal, playing an instrument, etc.

Summer is a wonderful time of year to enjoy the great outdoors, especially with our beautiful Pacific Northwest weather! However, we want to encourage students to make safe choices as they spend time outside this summer. We created a "Summer Safety Tips" slideshow as a resource for families. This resource provides important safety information regarding water activities (i.e. – swimming and boating), fireworks, wheels (bicycles, roller-blades, scooters, skateboards), walking, and heat.

Parents are requested to read and review these rules with their children.

- Playground equipment is used properly. No graffiti or damage to property. No hanging/climbing on or over fences, trees, light/flag poles, basketball hoops or building structures.
- Garbage is put in garbage cans
- Turf field is clean and free of damage
- No metal cleats or spikes are allowed on the turf field or playground
- No bikes, scooters or wheeled vehicles or toys of any kind are allowed on the turf field
- No gum or shelled seeds of any kind are allowed on campus

Nurse's Notes -

Washington Department of Health has made some changes and updates to school immunization requirements. Do these changes affect your child?

*Students in preschool or transitional kindergarten who are 4 years old or older on September 1, 2022, are now required to have an additional dose of DTaP, IPV, MMR, and Varicella vaccines prior to starting school.

*Students between the ages of 4 and 5 on September 1, 2022, will also need PCV and Hib vaccines prior to starting school.

All school aged children are required to be fully vaccinated or have a valid Certificate of Exemption on file prior to starting school. Any child that is not fully vaccinated or does not have a valid Certificate of Exemption will NOT be allowed to start school on September 6, 2022.

If you are uncertain if your student is fully vaccinated, or if you would like to complete a Certificate of Exemption for your student, please reach out to your student's primary care provider over the summer. You may also register with MyIR (My Immunization Registry) to access and view your student's immunization status at https://wa.myir.net/.

You can find more information on the 2022-2023 school and childcare immunization requirements at doh.wa.gov/scci.

Keep in mind, students with summer birthdays will have less time to get vaccinated before the start of school. So, plan ahead and make those appointments early.
