Camp Auburn for 5th Grade

Each year we take our fifth graders, along with 5^{th} grade teachers and high school students (who serve as counselors), to Camp Auburn located in nearby Ravensdale, Washington. Camp Auburn provides a valuable educational experience and is certainly a highlight of our year!

While at camp, students learn about the environment through a variety of fun and engaging science activities. They observe Northwest flora and fauna in their natural setting, learn survival skills such as shelter-building, and practice knot-tying and rope-making. Students and staff enjoy singing and socializing around a campfire, and grow in their appreciation for the importance of nature.

Camp Auburn is also an opportunity for students to build positive relationships and grow in their leadership skills. Under the guidance of our staff members, high school students work as camp counselors with the 5^{th} grade students. Staff and camp counselors continually stay with the 5^{th} grade students throughout the week and work with them on applying the skills they have learned in class. They also make the camp a lot of fun for the young campers!

Camp Auburn has literally been a pioneer in environmental studies for it is the oldest, consecutively run outdoor recreation program in the nation! The four days at camp are often one of the most memorable school experiences for students!

Social-Emotional Learning: Pt. 4 Relationship Skills

What are relationship skills?

Communicate clearly
Listen well
Cooperate with others
Resist inappropriate social pressure
Resolve conflict
Seek and offer help



You can help your child build relationship skills by...

Cooking With Your Child

Ask your child to help make dinner by following your directions, one at a time. Make sure to say "please" and "thank you" and acknowledge their efforts. This will not only help them learn about the art of listening, but it also teaches them about the importance of being polite to others.

Talk With Your Child About His/Her Day and Interests

Don't be satisfied with one-word answers. Parents have a lot on their plate but children need practice in expressing themselves clearly and completely.

Help Your Child Find Solutions to Problems S/he May Be Experiencing

Ask questions about what your child thinks s/he should do in any situation, and what the consequences of their solution will be. It is a good idea to start helping your child build this essential skill when they are young and problems are less serious.

Talk to Your Child About Friendships

Ask your children who their friends are and the qualities they look for in a friend. Make sure to ask about qualities they don't like and what makes a good friend.

Being a Good Example

Think about how you interact with your family and friends, and how you make and keep friends. Is your behavior setting a good example for your child?

The Importance of Being Present

Your child's daily, on-time attendance is critical to their success in school. And while some challenges to your child's school attendance are unavoidable, it's important to understand the impact of each absence.

- 1. When your child is not in class, they are missing out on critical learning. This puts them at risk of falling behind and not graduating from high school.
- 2. Even as few as two absences in a month, they are excused or unexcused, can make a big difference, from Kindergarten through their senior year.

What can you do to help?

- 1. Make showing up to school every day an expectation.
- 2. Help your child maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- 3. Don't let your child stay home unless they are truly sick.
- 4. Encourage meaningful school activities like clubs and sports.

Safety

Spring is a good time to revisit safety reminders here at school. Please take a moment to read through these reminders and discuss them with your child. Thank you in advance for ensuring you and your child follow these expectations so we work together to keep everyone safe at Pioneer Elementary.

Pedestrians and Crosswalks

• Students and parents must cross the street at crosswalks only and use the assistance of our crossing guards. Jaywalking or not following directions from crossing guards presents a risk for pedestrians to be hit by a vehicle.

Pedestrians and Sidewalks

- Parents and students should walk on sidewalks, or on the gravel path along the K Street fence. Please avoid walking behind parked vehicles, as drivers do not always see pedestrians when they back out of parking spots.
- Parents Remember that keeping a close eye on your children is helpful

Pedestrians and the Parking Lot

• When crossing from the school to the church parking lot, students and families must walk where a crossing guard is stationed. Please do not cross the parking lot in other areas, as this presents safety issues between vehicles and pedestrians.

Unloading and Loading into Vehicles

• Parents must unload and load children into vehicles in designated parking areas only. Unloading or loading people in the street presents a safety concern which could lead to a car accident or a pedestrian being hit by another vehicle.

Vehicles and Parking

- Thank you for your patience during arrival and dismissal time, as many vehicles use the church parking lot (south of the school) and the gravel area along the K Street fence.
- Please do not park in the grass or driveways of homes on the west side of K Street. Instead, look for an open parking space open along the K Street fence.

Bikes and Students

• Please remind your child that any student riding a bike to school must wear a helmet.
