

Applying for Free or Reduced-Price Meals -

Due to a waiver from the federal government, the ASD is providing free meals to all children ages 1-18 through the end of the calendar year. Specific information about times and locations is available on the ASD webpage. Beginning in January, students will need to qualify for free and reduced-price meals.

Families meeting certain household income requirements or currently receiving food assistance should apply **now** for meal benefits. Eligible families are encouraged to submit a new application for free and reduced-price meals now. Once the federal waiver expires, there will be no grace period for applying. Applying now allows time for the application to be processed and correct eligibility established.

As always, if eligibility status changes during the school year, a new application can be submitted. Please note, families who received benefits during the 2019-2020 school year must reapply.

We encourage everyone to apply for free or reducedprice meals! It's easy and quick. Families submit one application that includes all their students. The online application is found in Skyward Family Access and is the quickest way to apply. Paper applications are available in several languages in each school office or can be printed from the Child Nutrition page of the ASD website. Paper applications can be turned in to your child's school or to the Child Nutrition office.

Please note, every family needs to re-apply every year. If you have received a letter of qualification but not all of your children are listed, please contact Child Nutrition. You may reach Child Nutrition at (253) 931-4972 or email
