STUDENT AND STAFF RECOGNITION

1. Student Recognition

The Auburn School District Board of Directors will recognize Emma Nguyen, a fifth grade student at Pioneer Elementary, for being an outstanding student.

She is hard working and comes to school ready and excited to learn every day! Emma is diligent about getting her class work done and hasn't missed a homework assignment all year. She is a role model to her peers for always trying her best and having superb behavior. She is a sweet and polite girl.

At home, she enjoys making up games to play with her brother. They like to play Reindeer Round-up, where they run around the house and chase each other. She says it's a lot of fun.

Emma performed with the Auburn Elites this year. The Elites are a high level physical education performance team and Emma diligently devoted herself to making this team. Her persistence resulted in becoming a spotlight performer for Pioneer's recent performance. Emma is a remarkable example of how persistence and a drive for excellence can truly pay dividends.

Her favorite subject is math. When she grows up, Emma would like to work with animals and maybe be a veterinarian.

2. Staff Recognition

The Auburn School District Board of Directors will recognize Teresa Millard, a kindergarten teacher at Chinook Elementary, for being an outstanding staff member.

Teresa began her career in the Auburn School District in 2004 as a paraeducator at Washington Elementary. She also has taught summer school, been a substitute bus driver, and worked during the summer feeding program.

She did her student teaching at Evergreen Heights and then became a substitute teacher for two years, a half-time Native American math and reading intervention specialist, and is now in her third year settled into her own kindergarten classroom.

Chinook Principal Jennifer Davidson said, "Teresa's positive energy and positive assumptions about her students, their families, the community, and staff here at Chinook creates a collaborative atmosphere."

Teresa credits "Coach Davidson," the entire Chinook staff, her students and their families, and her own family for the success she has in the classroom.

She uses numbers to detail the success of her students:

- 87% of the Chinook kindergarten students already are at year-end benchmark for letter naming
- Students already know 34 vocabulary words (including gumption and bickering)
- She loves all 24 kids in her classroom

Cindy Mitchell, Chinook office professional, said "She makes learning fun in all of the wonderful things she does for her class."

Principal Davidson said Teresa consistently establishes an encouraging, safe, and warm relationship with her students so that they care about her, respect her, and are proud to be in her kindergarten class.

Teresa has been married to Dennis, dispatcher in the Auburn transportation department, for almost 23 years. They have three children. Son Brenton graduated from Auburn High in 2010, son Alex is a senior, and daughter Madison is a sophomore at Auburn High. Since she hails from Rhode Island, Teresa is a Boston Red Sox and New England Patriots fan. She enjoys watching sprint car racing and her kids' tennis matches and soccer games.

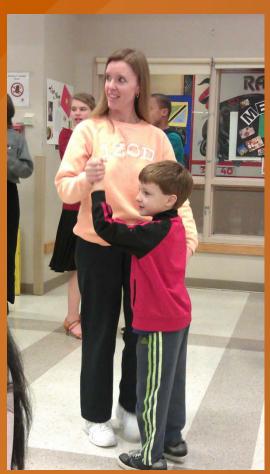

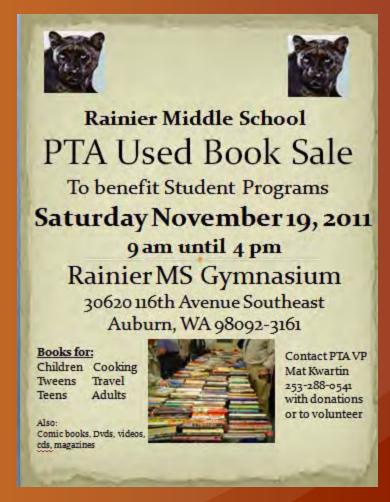

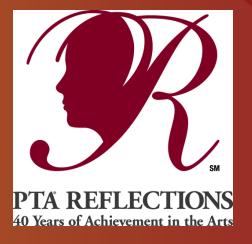

SCHOOL PROGRAMS AND STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

1. 2013-14 Arthur Jacobsen Elementary School PLC Presentation

Louanne Decker, associate superintendent of K-12 school programs, will introduce Eric Daniel, principal of Arthur Jacobsen Elementary School, who will introduce Stephen Christiansen and Naomi Elliott, Arthur Jacobsen Elementary School staff members, who will give a brief overview of how the Professional Learning Community model has been utilized to increase student achievement at Arthur Jacobsen Elementary School and answer questions from the board. Applications for federal funds require the signature of a school district representative who has been authorized by the board of directors. Such authorization is made part of the official board minutes.

3. Highly Capable Program—New Requirements

Rodney Luke, associate superintendent of K-12 student learning and technology, will introduce Heidi Harris, executive director K-8 student learning, and Julie DeBolt, director of assessment and NCLB, who will present an overview of the legislative revisions to Chapter 28A.185 RCW and Washington State Administrative Code WAC 392-170 requiring all districts to provide basic education services that meet the educational needs of the district's most highly capable students. The team will answer any questions the board may have.

What is 874?

Section 8003 Grant

Help local school districts that educate federally connected children.

- These may be the children
 - -of members of the uniformed services,
 - -children who reside on Indian lands,
 - -children who reside on Federal property or in federally subsidized low-rent housing,
 - -and children whose parents work on Federal Property.

Grant eligibility

- In general, to be eligible for assistance a local school district must
 - Educate at least 400 such children in average daily attendance

or the federally connected children must

 Make up at least 3 percent of the school district's total average daily attendance.

Children with disabilities who:

- (1) Reside on eligible federal property and have a parent on active duty in the uniformed services of the United States; or
- (2) Reside on eligible federal property with a parent who is both an accredited foreign government official and a foreign military officer; or
- (3) Reside on eligible Indian lands

Children with disabilities who DO NOT RESIDE ON FEDERAL PROPERTY BUT:

- (1) Have a parent on active duty in the uniformed services of the United States; or
- (2) Have a parent who is both an accredited foreign government official and a foreign military officer

Children who:

- (1) Reside on federal property with a parent employed on eligible federal property located at least partly within the school district; or
- (2) Reside on eligible federal property and have a parent on active duty in the uniformed services of the United States; or
- (3) Reside on eligible federal property and have a parent who is both an accredited foreign government official and a foreign military officer; or
- (4) Reside on eligible Indian lands

Children who reside on eligible federal property but whose parents are not employed on federal property

Highly Capable Program Changes

January 27, 2014

WAC 392-170

April 12, 2013

- Changes to the WAC became permanent on April 12, 2013
- Districts have the 2013-2014 school year to identify through the use of multiple, objective criteria those students (K-12) most highly capable and eligible to receive accelerated learning and enhanced instruction beginning in the 2014-2015 school year.
- Chapter 28A.185.020 RCW The legislature finds that, for highly capable students, access to accelerated learning and enhanced instruction is access to a **basic education**.
- Funding will be allocated based on 2.314% of each school district population

BULLETIN NO. 016-13 Title/LAP and CPR

May 22, 2013

"The 2013–14 school year will be a transition year for all districts to develop a plan for serving highly capable students in Grades K–12. Beginning with the 2014–15 school year, all districts are required to provide highly capable programs and services for students in Grades K–12".

WAC 392-170 Annual Plan

The district's plan for students who are highly capable shall be annually approved (June 9th) by formal action of the district's board of directors.

- The district's annual plan (iGrants form 217) shall contain:
 - 1. The number of K-12 students who are highly capable that the district expects to serve by grade level.
 - 2. A description of the district's plan to identify students.
 - 3. A description of the highly capable program goals.
 - 4. A description of the services the highly capable program will offer.
 - 5. A description of the instructional program.
 - 6. A description of ongoing professional development for educators of students who are highly capable.
 - 7. A description of how the program will be evaluated.
 - 8. A fiscal report.
 - 9. Assurances signed by the school district's authorized representatives that the district will comply with all applicable statues and regulations.

Requirements

- Annual public notification of parents and students must be made prior to any major identification activity.
- Districts must adopt procedures for the nomination process.
- Parent permission in writing must be obtained before conducting assessments to determine eligibility AND before placement in the district's highly capable program.
- Districts must have a Multidisciplinary (MDT) selection committee that consists of the following: A teacher, a psychologist, a certificated administrator in charge of the district's highly capable program.

PACE (Program for Accelerated and Clustered Education)

- In a walk to read/walk to math model, students walk to classrooms in the school for instruction at their assessed level of need.

STEP (Student Teacher Enrichment Program)

- Offered in grades 4-5
- Services at Terminal Park self-contained classroom for those students whose needs may not be easily met in the general education classroom.

Program ServicesSecondary

Middle School PACE

- Offered in grades 6-8
- Services delivered at every middle school
- In a Cohort model (similar to cluster model), highly capable students are placed together in Honors courses or Pre-AP classes and provided enrichment activities.
- In Out of Level placement models, highly capable students are placed in accelerated math or science classes (above their grade level)

High School PACE

- Offered in grades 9-12
- Services delivered at each comprehensive high school
- In a Cohort model (similar to cluster model), highly capable students are placed together in Honors, Pre-AP, or AP courses and provided enrichment activities.
- In Out of Level placement models, students are placed in accelerated math or science classes
- In Concurrent College and high school classes, students may access local university class, or running start (grade 11 and 12)

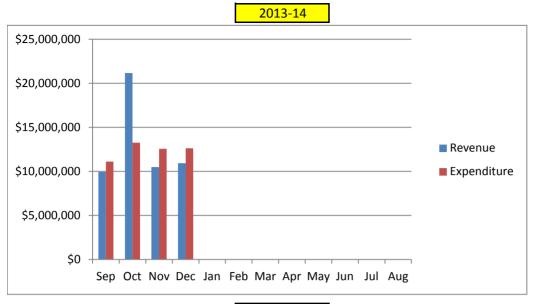

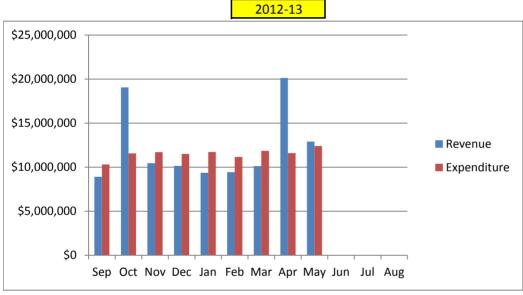

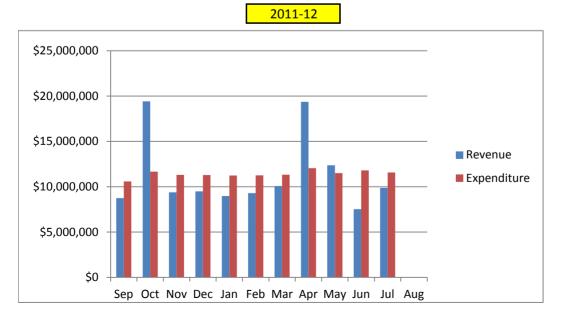
