#### STUDENT AND STAFF RECOGNITION

#### 1. Student Recognition

The Auburn School District Board of Directors will recognize Katie Christiansen, a fifth grade student at Dick Scobee Elementary, for being an outstanding student.

Katie is a model student who is mature beyond her years. She is reflective of herself, her peers, as well as the school environment. She works hard and prides herself on being an example to others both in and outside of school. She advocates on behalf of herself and her peers.

Katie ran for ASB president this year on a platform which inspired her classmates to vote for her by an overwhelming margin. She is patient and assists those around her in class, both academically and socially.

"Her leadership and poise will make her a successful and important part of the future," said Beth Raines, student support specialist at Dick Scobee.

As the ASB President, she is efficient, organized and a great problem solver. She is a Peer Helper at recess to help serve as a mediator for younger students and teach them to problem solve. She has been a crossing guard for the last two years and also is a Kinder Helper. Kinder Helpers assist classroom teachers in getting small groups of kindergarteners to their bus safely and on time, which can be a challenge.

Outside of school, Katie enjoys embroidering, sewing and spends her free time knitting hats for a prenatal unit in a Tacoma hospital. She enjoys dogs and is a self-proclaimed animal person. Her favorite subject in school is math and she hopes to follow in her mom's footsteps and become a nurse.

She has two older brothers, Auburn High grad Brandon and Rainier  $8^{\rm th}$  grader Blake.

#### 2. Staff Recognition

The Auburn School District Board of Directors will recognize Pilar Hunter, family engagement liaison at Olympic Middle School, for her outstanding service.

She started her role in the newly created family engagement liaison position in November, but she has been in the district for seven years. She has been a playground supervisor, worked the summer feeding program, been a one-on-one para-educator, a resource room para-educator and worked in the SLC program. In addition to her classroom duties, Pilar is active in the soccer program at Olympic, is the staff leader for the very active Latinos Unidos service club and is the LEAP facilitator.

Prior to working in the Auburn School district, Pilar was a UPS delivery driver for 15 years. She wanted a position that allowed her more time with her own children and working for the district was a perfect fit.

"I really, really love this school. I love the staff, I love the kids," she said.

Born in Renton, she is no stranger to moving around and meeting people. She attended 13 schools in various locations before graduating from high school in Texas. Her father retired as a government special agent and she moved to Puyallup.

She views her role as the family engagement liaison a perfect fit for her career aspirations. Her goal is to facilitate for families anything kids need to be successful in school. She is bilingual in Spanish and works closely with Olympic's Hispanic families.

#### 3. 2014-15 Classified Employees of the Year

The Auburn School District recognizes Lois Jensen and Christi Lee as the 2105 Classified Employees of the Year.

#### Lois Jensen

After volunteering for many years while her two sons attended Chinook, Lois began working for the district in 1998. She worked in ECE at Pioneer, Dick Scobee, and Washington. Her career in Auburn also included working ELL at Hazelwood and Mt. Baker and, for the past seven years, as an English Language Learner para-educator at Washington.

Lois has enjoyed all of her positions, but she especially likes working with ELL students. She works with all grade levels and she loves the success of the students in listening, reading, writing, and speaking.

Pauline Thomas, principal of Washington Elementary, said "Lois is committed to providing a supportive and challenging environment where all students have the opportunity to reach their full potential."

The Washington ELL team's work is paying off,  $4^{th}$  grade ELL students at Washington outperformed the state average on their reading assessment by 30.9% last year.

In addition to her work with students in ELL classes, Lois also likes to increase her skills. She has taken various district trainings including Spanish for Educators, Gang Awareness, and Safe Schools Workshop. She serves on the district-wide Career Center Advisory Committee, too.

Originally from Minnesota, she has lived in Washington for more than 40 years. Both of her sons attended Chinook, Olympic, and Auburn High School.

Lois enjoys working a seasonal job at Emerald Downs. In the summer, she spends time in Minnesota, visiting her 98 year old mother, enjoying her vacation home in Ocean Shores, and spending time with family. She has a 2 year old grandson and her second grandson is due April.

#### Christi Lee

Christi came to the Auburn School District 10 years ago after 14 years of working for Holland America cruise lines. She knew she wanted to make a difference for people and, after volunteering at both Gildo Rey and Lakeland Hills, she decided the school district was the place to make the difference.

She had been active in the PTA and yearbook as a volunteer and began her career in the Auburn School District as a substitute in the paraeducator pool. She worked at Gildo Rey, Alpac, Pioneer, and Terminal Park before landing her current job as a para-educator in the library at Lakeland Hills.

She loves working in the library. "It is such a rich environment," she said. "I get to work with all of the students in the school."

In addition to her position in the library, Christi oversees the school safety patrol program at Lakeland. She schedules and manages four adults and 30 students in the patrol program. Her favorite part of safety patrol is getting to know the students better. She also works with librarian Vickie Leaf on numerous after school clubs and projects including the Garden Club, Global Reading Club, and the spring bird hatching project.

"Her heart is with Lakeland Hills," said Vickie Leaf, who nominated Christi for this award. "She provides a presence for the Lakeland community that promotes caring, learning and safety."


Staff will focus on the 4 Questions of a PLC:

## SOCIAL STUDIES- GLOBAL ISSUES FOCUS

- 1. What do we want our students to know and be able to do? Students will understand:





# Why P-3?

- PreK-3<sup>rd</sup> grade reform is intended to reduce the achievement gap by 4<sup>th</sup> grade
- A high quality system across early childhood and early elementary creates the foundation for future success
- "Scalable, sustainable PreK-3<sup>rd</sup> models require 'The Three P's': effective partnerships, aligned professional development, and research-based policies"
- High quality instruction and student and family engagement in learning leads to better outcomes, but it must be present throughout all of the early years
- Bridging the gap between birth to five systems and the K-12 systems can be a challenge
  - Data systems do not align
  - In our state, led by separate agencies
  - Teacher training often does not typically cross-over between 0-5 and K-12


