STUDENT PARTICIPATION

1. Requests for Travel

- a. Thirty-five Auburn High School students request permission to travel to Seaside, Oregon, Friday to Saturday, September 18-19. The purpose of the trip is to attend the Cross Country Invitational. Lodging and meals will be at Camp Rilea and travel will be by charter bus. Lodging and meal expenses will be paid by students and travel expense will be paid by ASB funds. Greg Isham and Lacey Way, Auburn High School coaches, request permission to accompany the students. Substitutes will be needed for one day.
- b. Twelve Auburn Riverside High School students request permission to travel to Lake Buena Vista, Florida, Tuesday to Sunday, November 10-15. The purpose of the trip is to attend the National JEA/NSPA Journalism Convention. Lodging will be at the Walt Disney World Dolphin Resort, meals will be at local restaurants, and travel will be by airplane. All expenses will be paid by ASB funds. Gina Sandland and Tyler Sandland, Auburn Riverside High School teachers, request permission to accompany the students. Substitutes will be needed for three days.

SCHOOL PROGRAMS AND STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

1. 2014-20 District Technology Roll-Out Plan

Ryan Foster, associate superintendent of principal leadership and school programs, will introduce Jennifer Clouser, executive director of technology, who will introduce Doug Gonzales, assistant director of learning systems/classroom application support. The team will provide an update to the board of the district 2014-20 (six-year) capital technology levy implementation plan, share a PowerPoint presentation, and answer questions from the board. This presentation aligns with the 2013-16 District Strategic Plan Goal 1 student achievement, objective 4 technology, and the 2014-15 Stated District Goals Standard III create conditions district wide for student and staff success, Goal 1 increase the use of instructional technology for student achievement by having a process in place to support evaluation and updating of technology.

2. 2014-15 Spring Achievement and Semester 2 Report

Heidi Harris, assistant superintendent of student learning, will introduce Julie DeBolt, executive director of student learning and high school programs, who will present the 2014-15 spring DIBELS and MAP district assessment results, the 2014-15 second semester student achievement dashboards, including middle school honors, grade 9 credits earned, high school honors enrollment, advanced career and technical education program enrollment, and high school advanced placement program enrollment. This presentation aligns with the Auburn School Board 2013-16 school year stated district goals, Standard IV "Hold school district accountable for meeting student learning expectations" Goal 3, Goal 5, and goal 6. Ms. DeBolt will also answer any questions from the board.

3. Approval of Inter-local Agreement Providing Services to Students from Auburn School District to Lake Washington Institute of Technology

Heidi Harris will introduce Julie DeBolt, executive director of high school programs and assessment, will present this inter-local agreement. The agreement continues a partnership with Lake Washington Institute of Technology to provide vocational technical educational programs and services necessary to complete a high school diploma through their special purpose high school. This dropout reengagement program provides educational options for students 16-21 who have dropped out of high school or are not accumulating sufficient credits to reasonably complete a high school diploma before the age of 21. Permission is requested to contract with the Lake Washington Institute of Technology.

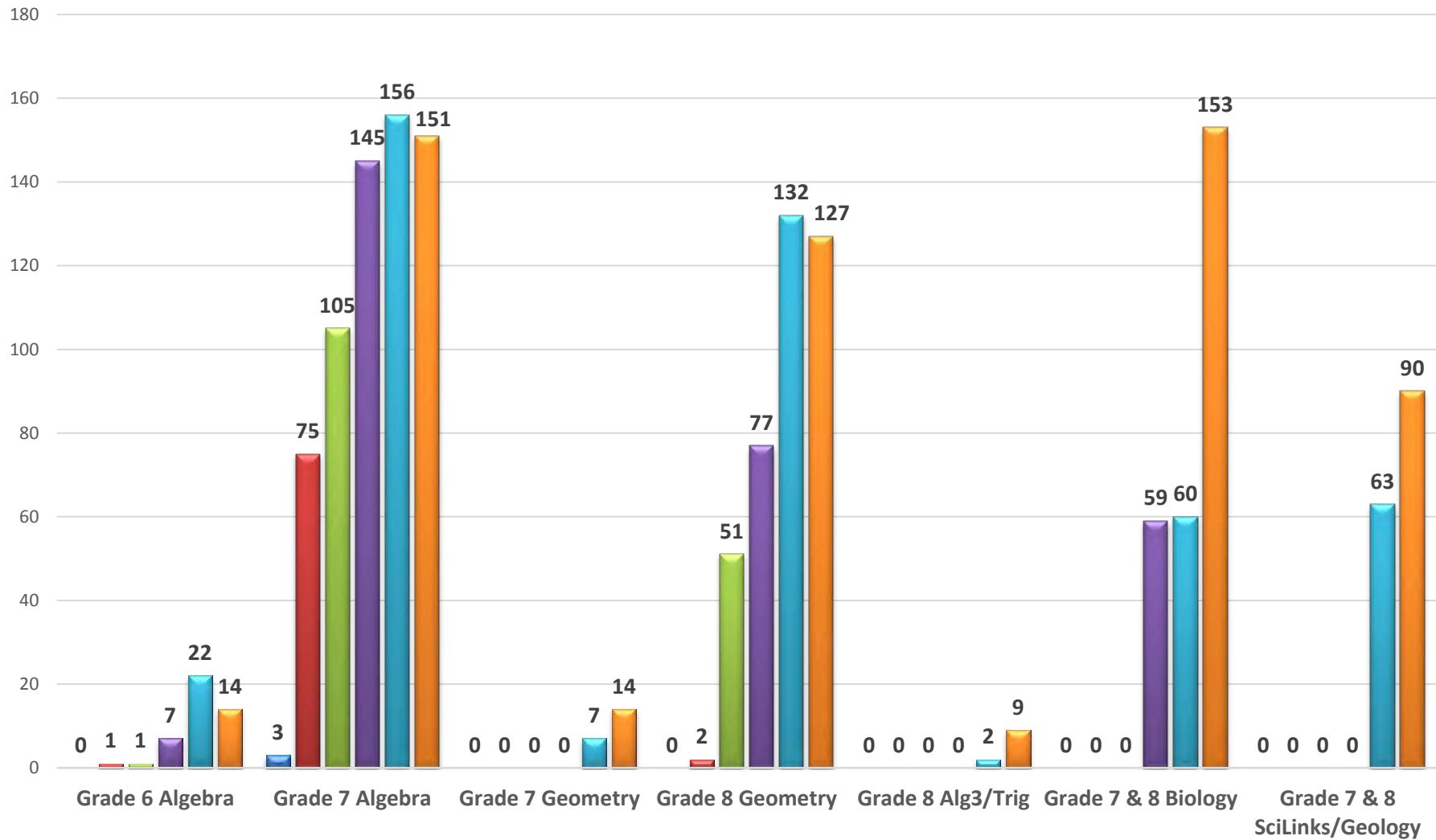

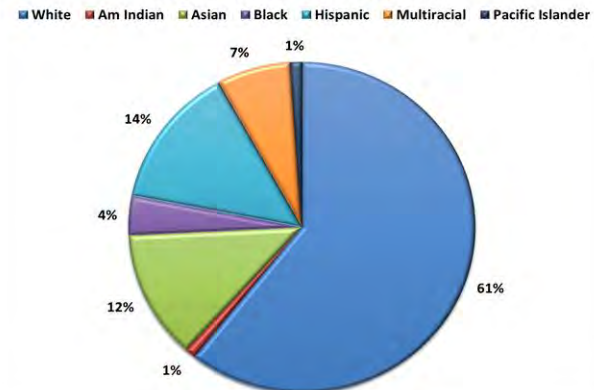
2008-2009 High School Honors Enrollments

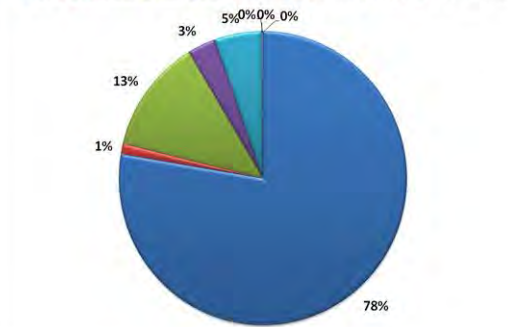

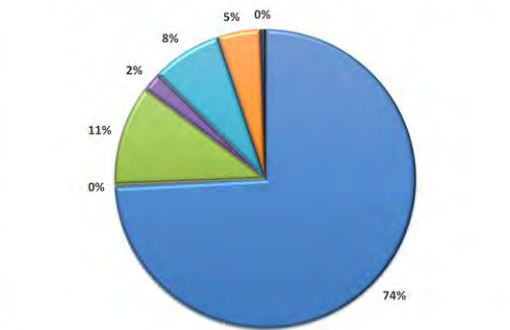

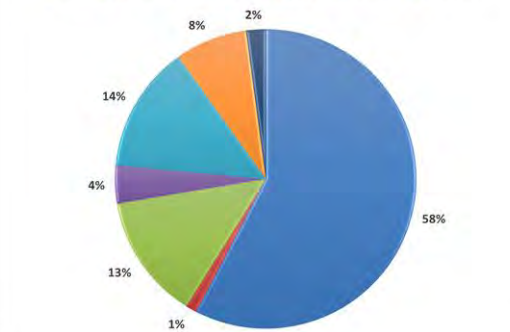
2008-2009 Advanced Placement Course Enrollments

We have served students from your district for many years through statutory authority allowing technical colleges to provide occupational and academic programs for high school students, and value the partnership. We provide these services through our accredited technical high school, Lake Washington Technical Academy and are proud to be the first program approved by OSPI under HB1418 Open Doors Dropout Reengagement. Our primary purpose is to provide educational options for students age sixteen to twenty-one who have dropped out of high school or are not accumulating sufficient credits to reasonably complete a high school diploma in a public school before the age of twenty-one.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES
FOR VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL AND BASIC EDUCATION
2015-2020

This agreement is hereby entered into by and between the Lake Washington Institute of Technology, District No. 26, King County, Washington, hereinafter referred to as the college, and the Washington State School district listed below, hereinafter referred to as the "resident district":

AUBURN SCHOOL DISTRICT 408

The purpose of this agreement is to utilize interlocal cooperation, as authorized by RCW 28A.150.275, RCW 28B.50.533, WAC 392-121-187, WAC 392-700, or any new statutory authority that may be created during the period of this agreement, to provide vocational-technical educational programs not otherwise available and to avoid duplication of specialized programs and facilities. These objectives will be achieved by the following described cooperative program:

The general purpose of this cooperative shall be to provide vocational-technical educational programs and services, and such basic education services as are necessary to complete the high school diploma, to high school students of the resident district at Lake Washington Technical Academy (LWTA) is accredited as a special purpose high school through AdvancED. Students earn high school and college credit.

The cooperative is expected to serve an average of 350 full-time equivalent students annually during the period 2015-2020 from some or all of the 32 resident districts that historically have sent students to the Lake Washington Technical Academy. Students must complete our variance for attendance release, signed by your designated school district official, on enrollment and annually for each school year. A copy will be returned to the school district.

The college will not bill the resident district for any excess costs incurred in providing vocational-technical or basic education programs and services to high school students of the resident district. The college will directly bill the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction pursuant to the provisions of RCW 28A.150.275, and will provide monthly reports to the resident district in accordance with WAC 392-121-187, WAC 392-700, or any new statutory authority that may be created during the period of this agreement. This agreement does not apply to Running Start enrollments.

The resident district will not bill the college for any costs incurred as a result of the college providing vocational-technical or basic education programs and services to high school students of the resident district. In order to avoid any claim in excess of one full-

time equivalent student, the resident district will notify the college in advance of any concurrent enrollment of resident district students participating in LWTA.

The resident district retains all responsibility for any special education services needed by resident district students attending LWTA. Students who withdraw or are expelled or dismissed will be referred back to the resident district.

Each party to this agreement shall be responsible for its own acts and/or omissions and those of its officers, employees and agents. No party to this agreement shall be responsible for the acts and/or omissions of entities or individuals not a party to this agreement.

Each party to this agreement acknowledges that entering into this interlocal cooperative arrangement may result in financial commitments by other parties to this agreement. Each party further acknowledges that while the agreement is for the term provided herein, program development is continuous and long-range planning is a requisite, and entering into this agreement may carry implications for succeeding school years. Therefore, each party agrees to notify the other by April 15 if the party decides to terminate the agreement in any year prior to its expiration. The parties agree this agreement may be terminated at any time with the consent of the other party.

This agreement is for a five year term of 2015-2020 and was approved by the resident district Board of Directors.

Protecting district property and the health, safety, and well-being of students and staff while on district property and attending district activities are important functions of the school district. Accordingly, the board authorizes the use of security recording equipment on district property and vehicles (see Board Policy 6608) for the sole purpose of the safety, health and welfare of all students, staff, community and visitors to district property, and to safeguard district facilities and equipment.

The superintendent or designee will develop and implement procedures concerning the access, use, and retention of video recordings and public notification concerning the installation and use of video equipment.
