PLANS FOR 2016-17

Alpac is implementing its new three year school improvement plan.

For ELA - Action Step: Strengthening the use of instructional time in daily common grade level ELA 60-75 minutes of core and 30-45 minutes of flexible leveled skill groups.

Implementation:

Balanced ELA:

- K-1 foundational skills (print concepts, phonological awareness, phonics/word recognition and fluency) and listening comprehension
- 2-3 foundational skills (phonics/word recognition and fluency), listening comprehension, reading comprehension, research and writing
- 4-5 foundational skills (phonics/word recognition and fluency), listening comprehension, reading comprehensions, research and writing

For Math - Action Step: Strengthen the use of instructional time in daily common grade level 60-75 minute core and 30-45 flexible leveled skill groups in math.

Implementation:

- Pre-K 5 follow district scope and sequence
- · Daily Balanced Math Block to include:
 - *Fact fluency
 - *Review
 - *Core instruction
- · Administer weekly and monthly building and district formative assessments

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

Alpac is a true community school we are the hub of both the Algona and Pacific communities. We have a dedicated staff who supports all learners from preschool through fifth grade.

We now have 210 Chrome books and 70 tablets as we continue to work towards our goal of 1 to 1 technology for all our students.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Communities in Schools onsite coordinator who facilitates the Food to Go program and our mentor program with Auburn Riverside High School
- Soccer for Success Needs based after-school soccer program sponsored by Washington Youth Soccer Association
- Pacific Bike Rodeo and other partnerships with police forces in both Algona and Pacific

We have an active PTA that raised over \$15,000 last year to help support our Accelerated Reading and Rich reading incentive programs.

LAP PROGRAM

Alpac is a Learning Assistance Program (LAP) school. LAP programs serve eligible students who need academic support for reading, writing and math, or who need readiness skills to learn these core subjects. With special emphasis on reading literacy in grades K-4, schools use their state LAP funds to deliver supplemental services that give these students the strong start they need for academic success.


