PLANS FOR 2016-17

For the 2016-2017 school year, we have the following three questions that we will focus on as a staff with the emphasis of providing DEEPER LEARNING EXPERIENCES FOR ALL STUDENTS. The three questions are connected to Cascade's vision of SPARTAN EXCELLENCE:

How do we grow deeper in our classroom instruction? (Strategy 1: Spartan Excellence In Our Daily Instruction)

How do we grow deeper in our relationships with our students and families? (Strategy 2: Spartan Excellence In Our Relationships With Our Students)

How do we grow deeper in our relationships with each other? (Strategy 3: Spartan Excellence Through Our Collaboration).

These three questions will be the framework of our professional development throughout the school year as well as be the guiding questions for our work around our revised school improvement plan.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

We are excited to continue our YMCA partnership through our CLC grant. This partnership has created numerous after school activities and a summer program for our students. For the upcoming school year, this program will continue to enhance our existing after school programs and create many new ones. The purpose of this partnership is to create relationships with students outside of the school with the intent of having students feel connected to the school. By accomplishing this, we hope to increase student attendance, decrease student discipline and increase academic performance.

Another highlight for this school year is our implementation of our PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports) model. With this new model, we hope to provide behavior intervention and supports that will help change student behavior and decrease student suspensions. This model is huge on communicating with parents and involving parents in the process. This is why we wanted to implement this model. We hope to have more resources next year to help support our PBIS model.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

In addition to parent conferences, Cascade offers content nights for parents to attend. These content nights allow parents to be exposed to the curriculum and participate in activities to help them understand the curriculum. This year we are also partnering with GUIDED PATHWAYS, an organization that helps to organize parent workshops.

Our YMCA also offers opportunities for community engagement through a series of parent nights that are focused on our families represented through our student demographics. These parent nights help provide us with information on how to better serve these families and give us the opportunity to share information regarding the school.

TITLE PROGRAM

Cascade is a Schoolwide Title I school. This means that all students at Cascade are Title I students! Title I is a federally funded program developed to help schools raise the literacy and math levels of students. Teachers, parents and especially our students benefit from this unique status. As a Schoolwide Title I school, Cascade is able to offer high quality instruction to ALL children. Cascade students may receive extra support in reading and math. We are working to improve student learning each year through partnership efforts between our staff, parents and students.

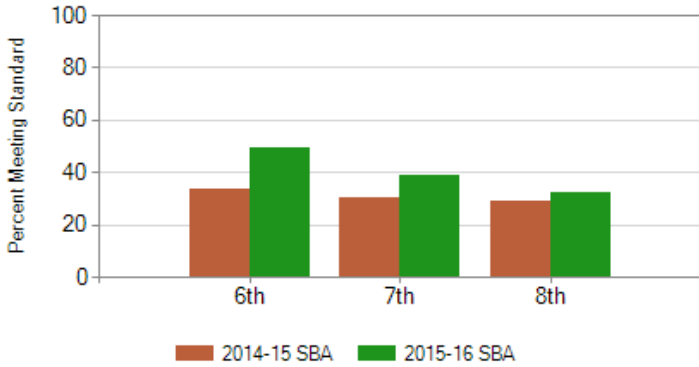

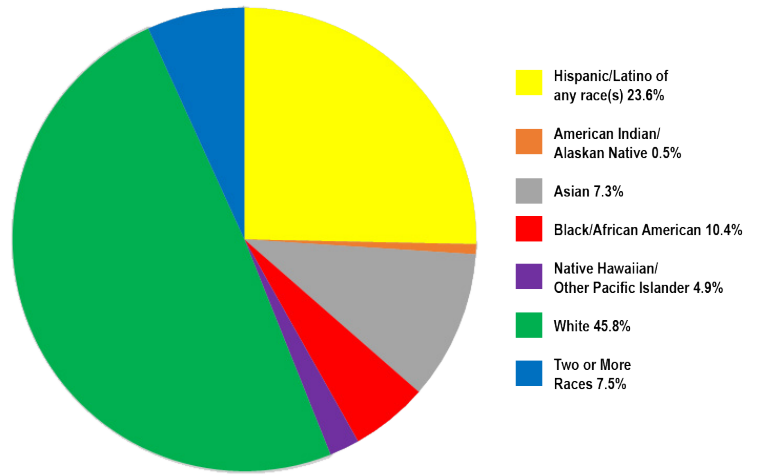

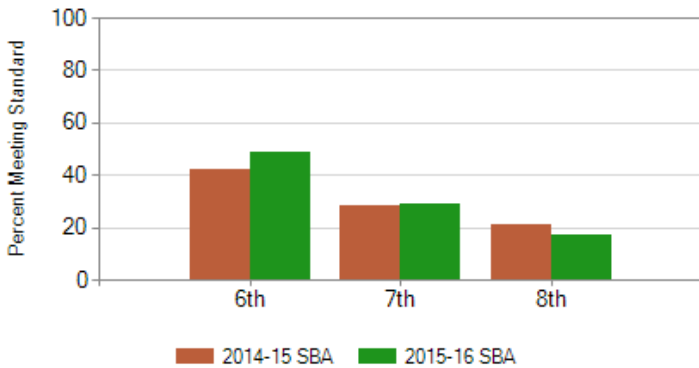
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS - Grades 6, 7 & 8



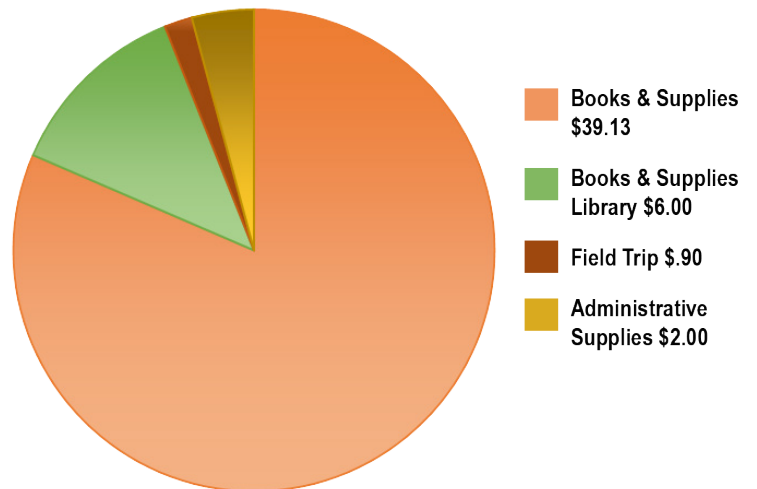
OUR STUDENT COMMUNITY AT CASCADE
