As a school with tremendous diversity, Gildo Rey Elementary has met the challenging goal of being a National School of Distinction. To meet the needs of our students, we are continually seeking to train and equip our staff to be highly responsive to the academic and social-emotional needs of our students. Staff is committed to ongoing improvement and refinement of implementing research-based best practice instructional strategies to most effectively meet the individual needs of each student and assist students in demonstrating mastery of the state performance expectations. Data from standardized tests, performance-based assessments and individual student performance assessments form the basis for the establishment of our instructional goals and strategies that support our students meeting standard and performing at high levels.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

Gildo Rey Elementary is an award winning school with an extremely dedicated staff. We are recognized as a National School of Distinction, a Reward School, a Washington Achievement Award School and a National Title I Distinguished School. Our belief is that all students can learn and that relationships are foundational to positive student behavior, citizenship and high academic achievement. We use Capturing Kids' Hearts and CHAMPS to help us reach all students and support them in doing their personal best. We also use Steps to Respect and Kelso's Choice to teach and reinforce positive behavior choices and help students develop responsibility and relationships. Communities in Schools supports students with clothing, meals to go and after school tutoring. Two computer labs and a Tech Levy disbursement of Chromebooks and Tablets and tremendous PTA support provide computer literacy for all students. We also support our students through a variety of before, during and after school opportunities including: music, library, technology, art, physical education, recognition assemblies for citizenship, effort and academics, Soccer for Success Program, basketball, volleyball, Homework Club, Kids' Day and our annual Multi- Cultural Fair.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Gildo Rey Elementary is closely connected to the Auburn community. We enjoy the tremendous support of Auburn Communities in Schools and have a (CIS) on-site coordinator. We are also supported by our Auburn School District Family Liaison and our extremely supportive PTA who work closely with our counselor and CIS coordinator to support the many needs of our students and families.
