PLANS FOR 2016-17

Lea Hill is in year three of a three-year school improvement plan. Our Building Leadership Team meets twice a month to plan our school improvement work. This team works with our staff to monitor goals and action steps that will help our students be successful. This process looks at data, identifying strengths and challenges. We collected input from staff, students and families. We adjust the plan as needed. Our plan also incorporates technology integration. Second Step is our Social Emotional Learning and Anti-Bullying curriculum. It teaches skills in recognizing and managing emotions, having empathy, controlling impulses, communicating clearly, cooperation, responsibility and problem solving. This year we are focusing on positive relationships with our students and positive discipline interventions, reducing the need for Think-Times, Lunch-Detentions, and suspensions. Each grade level also partners with a specialist teacher to provide some after school enrichment clubs.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

- We have genuine real-world diversity. We are always one of the top schools in Auburn for total number of languages spoken. Our ELL program is outstanding and a great source of pride for our school.
- We are an award-winning Green School and have a courtyard filled with fruit and vegetable gardens.
- We received a King County grant to help us purchase an \$80,000 play structure for our playground.
- Last year our Science MSP scores were the second highest in Auburn!
- We have a Nature Trail on the backside of campus for outdoor learning.
- We proudly houses the district elementary level Pathways behavior program. Students in this program are extremely successful.
- Lea Hill celebrated its' 50th anniversary in June of 2015.
- Lea Hill has more preschool classrooms than any school in Auburn (three ECE and one Head Start).
- The entire staff meets together for PLC Mondays. We review common assessments for ELA and Math and we use the data to drive instruction and interventions.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- In partnership with AMHS, staff and parent volunteers offered the first after-school elementary robotics program in the ASD.
- We have a long and proud history of community support, including a PTA that raises thousands of dollars a year. The Lea Hill ASB provides school spirit weeks throughout the vear.
- Lea Hill has supportive volunteers that regularly work with our students and staff.
- School Board Gold Star Volunteer recognition for a Lea Hill community member who maintains our gardens and teaches our students about growing plants for healthy
- A local church helps support some of our needy families with weekly food donations,
- Lea Hill's ELL team puts on an amazing Multicultural Fair and partners with AMHS for additional support.
- Several AMHS student future educator program volunteers work closely with our teachers to provide support and enrichment for our students.

LAP PROGRAM

Lea Hill is a Learning Assistance Program (LAP) school. LAP programs serve eligible students who need academic support for reading, writing and math, or who need readiness skills to learn these core subjects. With special emphasis on reading literacy in grades K-4, schools use their state LAP funds to deliver supplemental services that give these students the strong start they need for academic success.






