As well, Riverside has embarked on a mission to get WiFi hot spots into the homes of students and families who are currently without this vital academic and engagement tool. Auburn Riverside continues to provide after-school tutoring by certificated staff in core content areas. As well, Auburn Riverside’s unique FLIGHT Academy provides support to 9th and 10th grade students to help ensure their academic success during the pivotal transition years.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

Auburn Riverside highlights center around kids and our devoted staff. From the minute students enroll at Auburn Riverside, wheels are in motion to help them find academic and emotional success. Our Raven Crew program enlists over 200 upperclassmen leaders to welcome and forge relationships with incoming freshmen in hopes of easing their transition to high school. The forging of relationships and creating a culture of compassion continues this year with our bi-annual “Breaking Down the Walls” event. Our entire student body will be engaged in an all school assembly and then over 600 students and staff members will partake in three, day-long events of sharing, learning and growing together as RAVENS. A culture of compassion, understanding and acceptance is noticeable at Auburn Riverside. We like to call it #whoweAR!

Academically, a full range of Advanced Placement courses, advanced level performing arts, and world languages, as well as advanced CTE courses, are offered meeting every student’s learning needs. Students are able to develop and pursue a personalized education by selecting courses from a greatly diversified course catalog.

Auburn Riverside works to keep a balance between academics, athletics and activities. Over 40 clubs and a full array of freshmen, JV and Varsity athletic programs await students. Many of these programs compete regularly in regional, state, and national competitions each year.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Auburn Riverside continuously invites and shares with its community. A full time, bilingual Family Engagement Liaison works with all families to help them connect with teachers and the school community. Our Career Center also hosts career and college planning nights, along with supporting our Future Freshmen and a variety of other parent information nights. ARHS staff participate in community outreach each August and September. Teachers and counselors reach out to families by knocking on their doors, in their own neighborhoods, welcoming new students to the AR family. This welcoming and information sharing opportunity has been met with tremendous appreciation from our families.

Parents and community members are invited to participate in school activities.

TITLE PROGRAM

Auburn Riverside is a school-wide Title I school. This means all students at Auburn Riverside are Title I students! Title I is a federally funded program developed to help schools raise the literacy and math levels of students. Teachers, parents and especially our students benefit from this unique status. Auburn Riverside students may receive extra support in reading, English language arts, science and math. We are working to improve student learning each year through partnership efforts between our staff, parents and students.

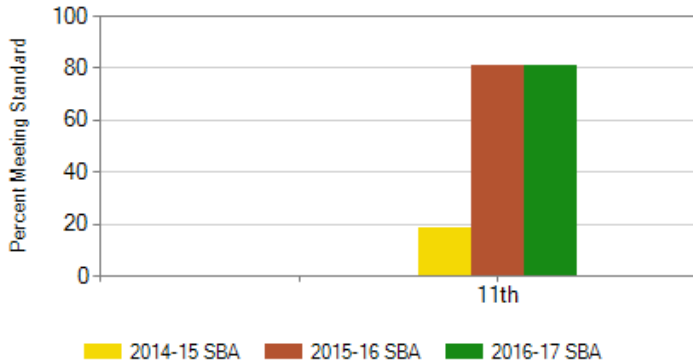

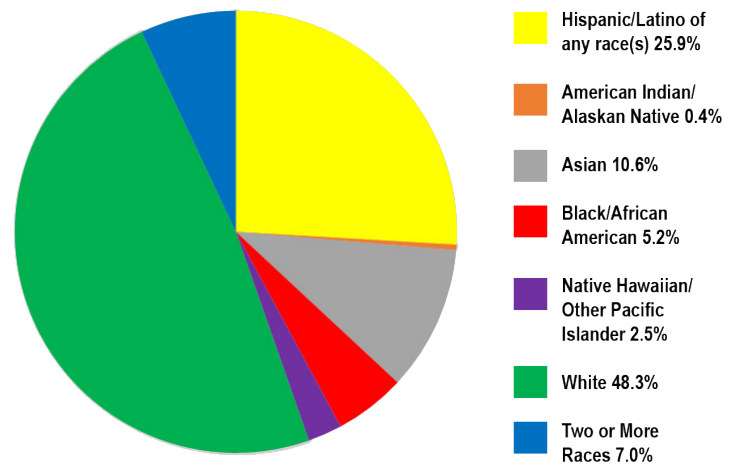

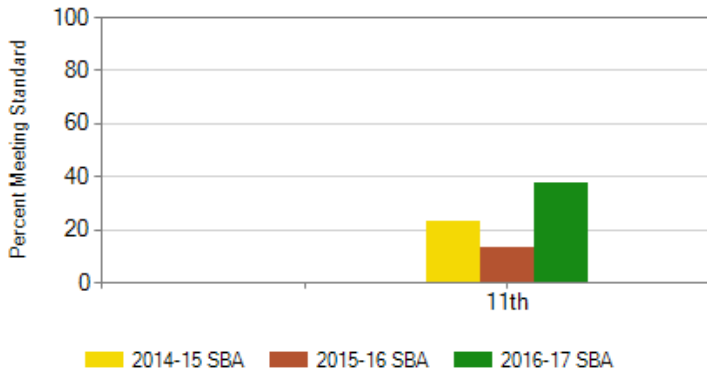
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS - Grade 11



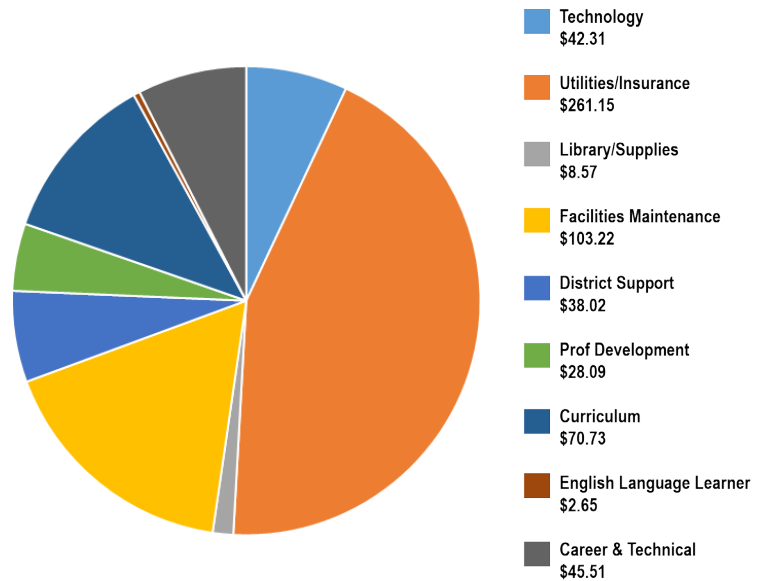
OUR STUDENT COMMUNITY AT AUBURN RIVERSIDE



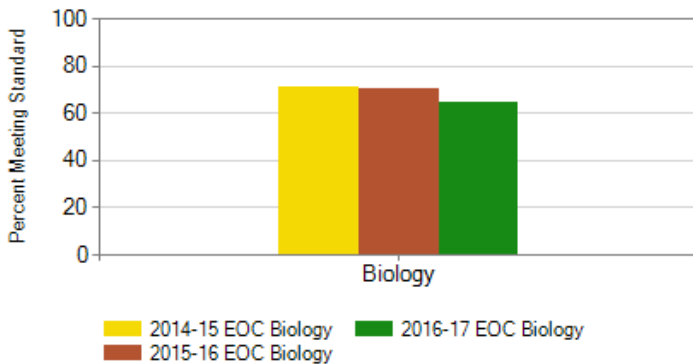
MATH - Grade 11
