PLANS FOR 2017-18

Chinook Elementary has completed the SIP plan for 2015-2018. Academic achievement for all students will continue to be the priority at Chinook. We provide intense, rigorous instruction with common teaching practices in order to increase student participation and critical thinking. We also have a building-wide system focused on positive behavior strategies (PBIS) in place to ensure students have the skills they need to be successful and productive citizens. Along with all students reading at or above grade level and being able to problem solve using mathematical concepts, we also want students to learn the importance of stamina and perseverance. We are also increasing technology instruction at all grade levels. Our efforts will help our children be successful at this new level of learning. Our plan for 2017-2018 is to increase student motivation, strengthen collaboration, and enhance our instructional strategies focused on student engagement.

Second Step is our Social Emotional Learning and Anti-Bullying curriculum. This research-based curriculum teaches students skills in recognizing and managing emotions, having empathy, controlling impulses, communicating clearly, cooperation, responsibility and problem solving.

In 2017 Chinook received a \$5000 King County Best Starts for Kids grant that will help staff and students address the impacts of stress and adversity so children and youth can bounce back after experiencing life difficulties. In 2016 we received a \$400 grant from the Auburn Public Schools Foundation that provides healthy afternoon snacks for young students. Chinook primary grades are instructed in Spanish by our bilingual primary learning specialist once a week for 45 minutes. Students who might need extra math or English practice are invited to attend morning math or after school ELL classes. Additionally, Chinook fifth grade students can participate in safety patrol, Global Reading Challenge, District Choral Festival, before-school band and orchestra, after-school volleyball and basketball, and three days and nights of outdoor education at Camp Auburn.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Chinook has successful and supportive relationships with the following community partners: Muckleshoot Indian Tribe; Cowlitz Tribe; King County Library; Green River Community College; Kiwanis and Auburn Noon Lions Club.

Communities in Schools provides supplies and snack packs. Head Start offers free preschool for low-income families. Music and art teachers using Music and Movement offer performances open to parents. Our library outreach program provides Chinook families access to books. The family BBQ and 4th grade science fair is well attended. A Spanish-speaking family night provides important school information to parents. Chinook is an award-winning recycling and composting Green School and has a courtyard filled with planters and a vegetable garden.

All parents and community members are invited to participate in school activities.

LAP PROGRAM

Chinook is a Learning Assistance Program (LAP) school. LAP programs serve eligible students who need academic support for reading, writing and math, or who need readiness skills to learn these core subjects. With special emphasis on reading literacy in grades K-4, schools use their state LAP funds to deliver supplemental services that give these students the strong start they need for academic success.






MATH - Grades 3, 4 & 5




