PLANS FOR 2017-18

We are focused on a school-wide process for developing a new School Improvement Plan (SIP). Each staff member resides on a committee for one of three SIP goals (ELA, Math and Environment). We will spend many hours analyzing current and historical trend data. Staff will generate a list of strengths and challenges from which we will prioritize the challenges and create School Improvement Goals. Each goal will have action steps/strategies rooted in research for high yield strategies. Those action steps/strategies will then become the focus for professional development, implementation and monitoring. We are implementing No Excuses University to our plan as we continue to get kids college and career ready. We will continue to use Equity and Visible Learning as our lenses in implementing the work we do.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

Several systems and characteristics of Dick Scobee make it a special place for learning. We have multi-tiered systems of support for academics, social emotional learning, positive behavior interventions and relationships. Each of the aforementioned areas contain a core level of skills, experiences and concepts provided to all students. In recognizing that not all students need the same supports for success, there are Tiers II and III for students that need more for mastery. We are beginning our second year with Sound Discipline to continue our work in supporting students behaviorally and emotionally. Students at Dick Scobee have opportunities to expand the breadth of experiences through classes, activities and clubs that happen during school and after school. Clubs/classes include technology, robotics, art, dance, music, drama and African History. We value supporting each and every child to be ready for success as advocates and consumers of the educational system beyond our building.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

We have developed a strong foundation of community and family engagement. Monthly, we host events that serve the needs of our families. Some of these events celebrate our diversity in the form of "Multicultural Nights," while others are focused on providing parents with tools and information to support their child at home in reading and math. We host family movie nights, craft nights and more. We are launching our third cohort for a Parent Advisory Board and Parent Education Project. Parents and guardians are invited to attend a series of classes to empower them in successfully supporting their child in navigating the public educational system. We also have formal relationships with at least eight community-based organizations such as the Auburn Food Bank, Nexus Youth Resources and King County Library System.

All parents and community members are invited to participate in school activities.

TITLE PROGRAM

Dick Scobee is a school-wide Title I school. This means that all students at Dick Scobee are Title I students! Title I is a federally funded program developed to help schools raise the literacy and math levels of students. Teachers, parents and especially our students benefit from this unique status. As a school-wide Title I school, Dick Scobee is able to offer high quality instruction to ALL children. Dick Scobee students may receive extra support in reading and math. We are working to improve student learning each year through partnership efforts between our staff, parents and students.






MATH - Grades 3, 4 & 5




