PLANS FOR 2017-18

During the 2017-2018 school year, Evergreen Heights will continue working on our three-year school improvement plan. We set goals and created action steps that will help each student master skills at their grade level and throughout their academic career. To create a viable school-wide plan, we analyzed data and identified strengths and challenges. We are focusing on reading/writing, math and school attendance. We are also dedicated to increasing technology skills through the use of Chromebooks. The school improvement process has been instrumental in our student achievement and academic success.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

Evergreen Heights Elementary is a Washington School of Distinction award winner for multiple school years. The Puget Sound Educational Service District recognizes schools that show sustained improvement over a five-year period in reading/English language arts (ELA), and math. Evergreen Heights was also recognized as a National Title I School of Distinction for multiple years for “closing the Achievement Gap” in mathematics and reading. The success of our school is a result of hard work, high expectations and collaboration between staff, students, and parents.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Community and family engagement is extremely important for the success of student learning at our school. Evergreen Heights works in combination with the PTA to host monthly family nights including a fall festival, holiday shop, family game night, PJ’s and Popcorn, a talent show and family dance. This includes regular skate nights at the Auburn Skate Connection. For the past four years, our school has partnered with the University of Washington to enhance professional development for our English Language Learners. We have also worked with many outside agencies such as Kiwanis, Rotary and Communities in Schools. All of these community programs support our students and their achievement.

All parents and community members are invited to participate in school activities.

LAP PROGRAM

Evergreen Heights is a Learning Assistance Program (LAP) school. LAP programs serve eligible students who need academic support for reading, writing and math, or who need readiness skills to learn these core subjects. With special emphasis on reading literacy in grades K-4, schools use their state LAP funds to deliver supplemental services that give these students the strong start they need for academic success.

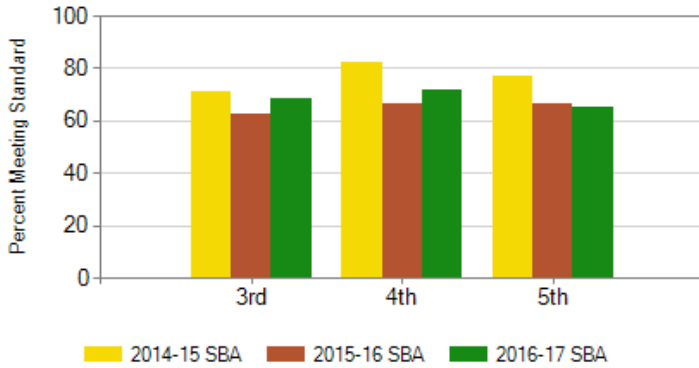

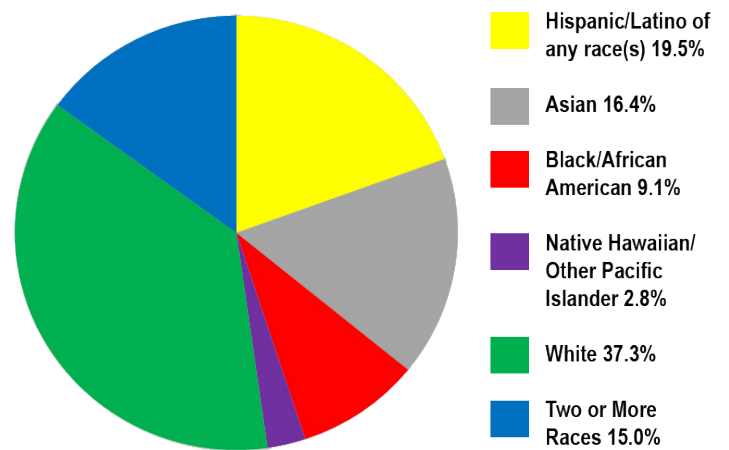

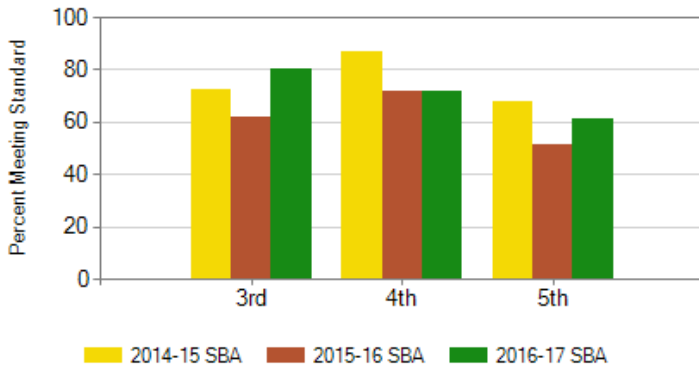
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS - Grades 3, 4 & 5



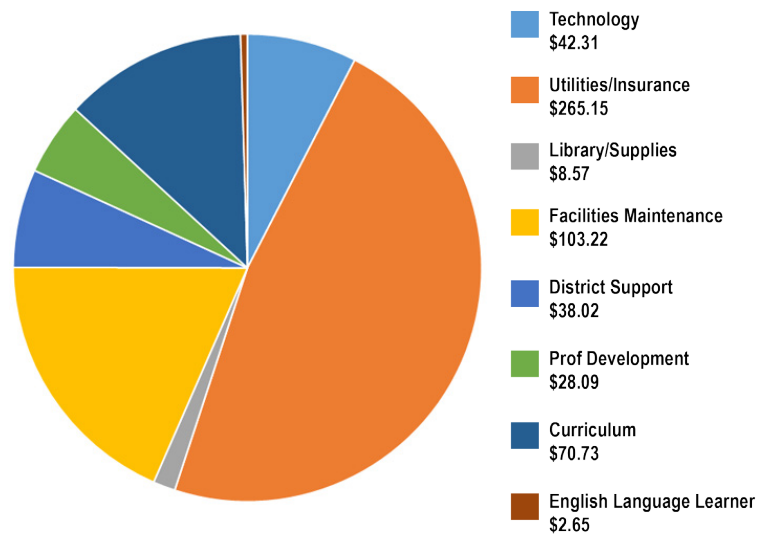
OUR STUDENT COMMUNITY AT EVERGREEN HEIGHTS



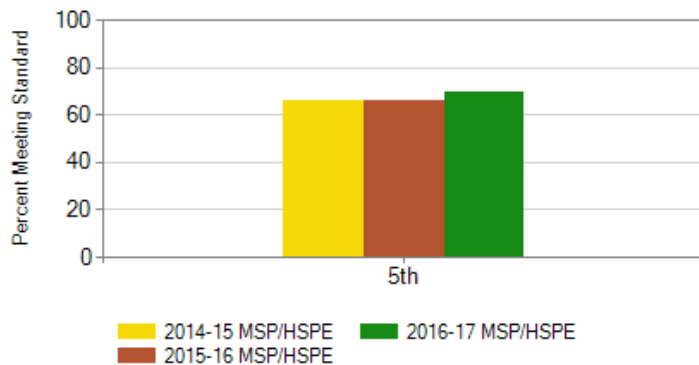
MATH - Grades 3, 4 & 5
