### PLANS FOR 2017-18

Lea Hill is in year one of our newly revised school improvement plan. Our building leadership team meets twice a month to plan our school improvement work. This team works with our staff to monitor goals and action steps that will help our students be successful. This process looks at student growth data to identify strengths and challenges. Our plan also incorporates best practices for reading and math instruction, as well as our work to provide an equitable education for all students. We are continuing our focus on building positive relationships with our students and positive discipline interventions. Another focus this year will be the implementation of the No Excuses University philosophy. As a part of this process, staff will create exceptional systems that increase student achievement and prepares all students for their education beyond high school.

### HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

- We received a Best Starts for Kids grant to create or strengthen environments that better support children.
- In November 2016, the Auburn community passed a bond to replace six aging schools and build two new elementary schools. Lea Hill will be replaced as part of this bond.
- Funded through the Auburn community's support of the 2014 technology levy, this year all LH students will have 1:1 technology access.
- Our fifth grade students continue to score above the state average on the state science assessment.
- The diversity of our student population is representative of the community in which we serve.
- We are an award-winning Green School and have a courtyard filled with fruit and vegetable gardens.
- Our entire staff meets together for PLC Mondays. We review our student data to drive instruction and provide individualized interventions.
- We proudly house the district elementary level Pathways program, two ECE classes, and a Head Start Program.
- We have a nature trail on the backside of campus for outdoor learning.
- We have a student-led ASB that organizes school spirit weeks and fundraisers for student events.

### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- AMHS students, staff members, and parent volunteers organize an after-school Robotics program.
- Lea Hill's ELL team partners with local high schools and community members to host an annual Multicultural Fair.
- We have a proud history of community support, including a PTA that fundraises to provide programs that support student learning.
- Lea Hill volunteers regularly work with our students and staff.
- A Lea Hill volunteer maintains our gardens and teaches students about growing plants for healthy eating.
- A local church supports our families with weekly food donations.
- In partnership with the Auburn Food Bank, we provide meals for families.
- AMHS future educator students work with our teachers to provide support and enrichment for students.
- All parents and community members are invited to participate in school activities.

### LAP PROGRAM

Lea Hill is a Learning Assistance Program (LAP) school. LAP programs serve eligible students who need academic support for reading, writing and math, or who need readiness skills to learn these core subjects. With special emphasis on reading literacy in grades K-4, schools use their state LAP funds to deliver supplemental services that give these students the strong start they need for academic success.

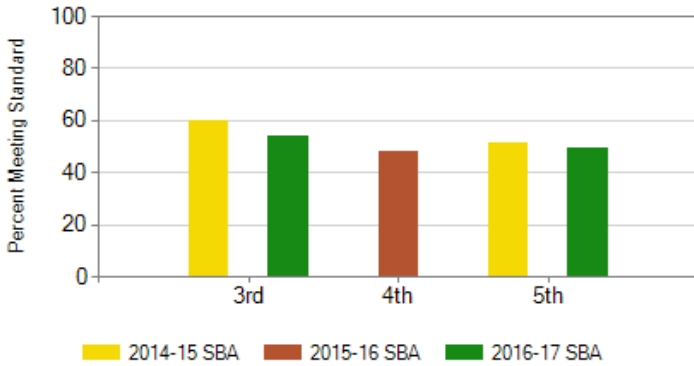

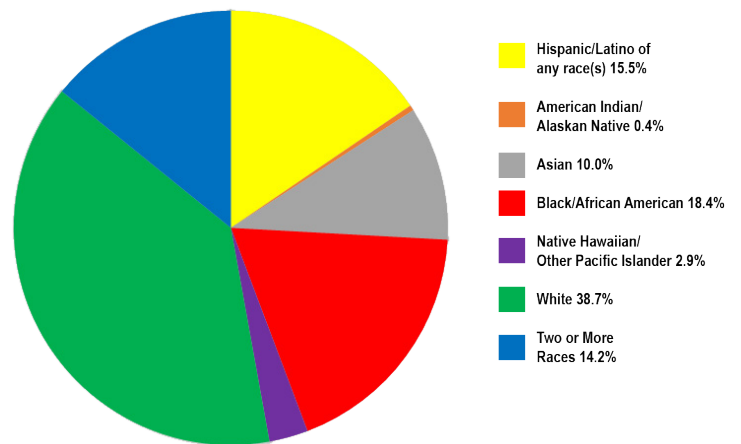

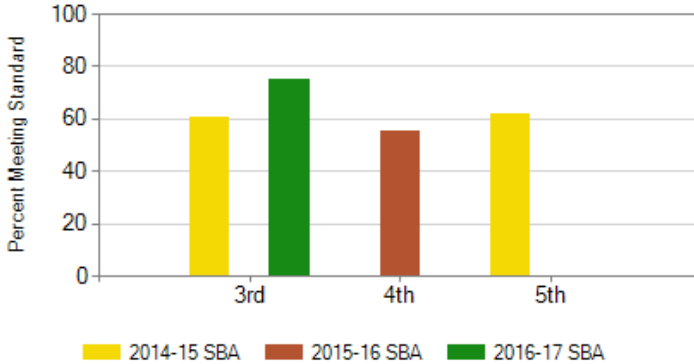
### ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS - Grades 3 & 5



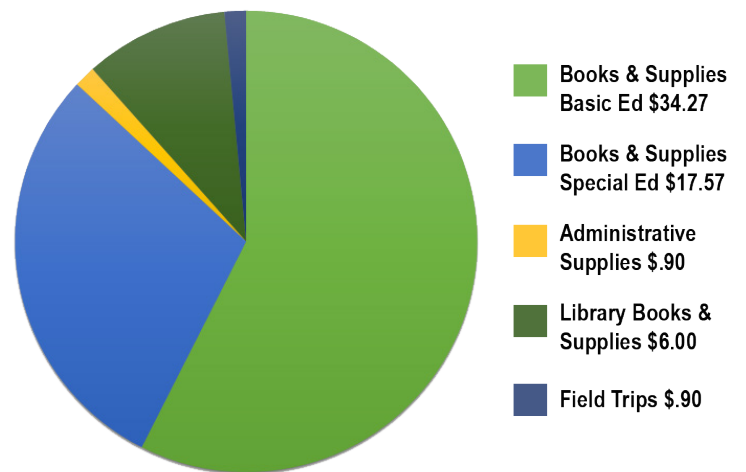
### OUR STUDENT COMMUNITY AT LEA HILL



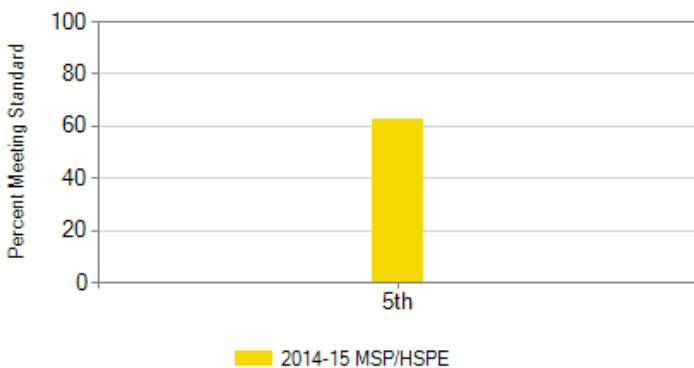
### MATH - Grades 3 & 5
