PLANS FOR 2017-18

Terminal Park Elementary focuses on implementation of our strategic improvement plan. 




ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS - Grades 3, 4 & 5




MATH - Grades 3, 4 & 5




SCIENCE - Grade 5
