PLANS FOR 2017-18

West Auburn High School is successfully implementing a building-wide Title I Program with a focus on being a trauma informed school. Our School Improvement Plan includes using our school-wide vocabulary assessments, as well as increasing our usage of learning targets and success criteria. Teachers are using a consistent measure of student's progress and enriching their collaboration through our Professional Learning Community, along with focused data review and professional development.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

Between 200 and 275 students in grades 9 through 12 are served at West Auburn. Unique program options offer flexible learning environments for a diverse student population. Students are provided the opportunity to experience a quality education by participating in programs designed to support academic, physical, social and emotional well-being to experience successes in school. A variety of programs affords students opportunities to maximize the number of earned credits and/or coordinate work and class hours when necessarv.

West Auburn's individualized programs have evolved and continue to evolve to meet student and community needs. Students take a variety of courses for core requirements, electives, and career and technology subjects. Although class requirements are stringent, students find the atmosphere at West Auburn to be relaxed, and staff members supportive of personal learning styles. The programs offered at West Auburn include: Day School (six-period day), Learning Center, Virtual (online), Virginia Cross Native Education Center and the Auburn Opportunity Project (AOP). AOP is our partnership with Seattle Education Access as well as other agencies which include Open Doors at GRCC, to help re-engage youth and achieve either a GED or high school diploma through non-traditional routes.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Along with inviting families into our school for events including Open House and Student Led Conferences, West Auburn is involved in several community activities and partnerships. Students are encouraged to participate in Tech Prep and Running Start programs while at West Auburn. West Auburn maintains an active partnership with Nexus Youth and Families to provide additional counseling resources for students. We also partner with local civic organizations including Rotary and the Auburn Food Bank. We also participate in the annual Auburn Clean Sweep event.

All parents and community members are invited to participate in school activities.

TITLE PROGRAM

West Auburn is a school-wide Title I school. This means all students at West Auburn are Title I students! Title I is a federally funded program developed to help schools raise the literacy and math levels of students. Teachers, parents and especially our students benefit from this unique status. As a school-wide Title I school, West Auburn is able to offer high quality instruction to ALL children. West Auburn students may receive extra support in reading, English language arts, science and math. We are working to improve student learning each year through partnership efforts between our staff, parents and students.






OUR STUDENT COMMUNITY AT WEST AUBURN




