PLANS FOR 2017-18

Washington Elementary is committed to the success of all students as they explore their tomorrows today. We continue our focus on the fundamentals of reading and math and students receive differentiated instruction based on their performance from formative and summative assessments. Walk to Read groups are leveled targeting phonic skills and reading fluency and accuracy. Students in all grade levels receive balanced math instruction including fact fluency, problem solving and student engaging instruction. Classroom technology is an integral part of each classroom and supports classroom instruction and individual learning needs.

HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR SCHOOL

There are many programs and activities at Washington Elementary that serve to enrich, extend and celebrate student achievement.

- Weekly recognition for BRAVO students: Students who demonstrate Responsibility, Respect and Readiness to learn.
- Student of the month assembly recognizing students who exemplify the Word of the Month.
- 21st Century Grant partnering with the YMCA to provide after-school enrichment 5 days a week including a six-week summer school.
- · Washington State Green School with emphasis on recycling.
- Soccer for Success is a program that provides a free ten week after-school soccer program both in the fall and in the spring.
- A dynamic PTA organization which generously gives of their time and energy sponsoring assemblies, camp scholarships, playground equipment, family nights, and our new reader board.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

At Washington Elementary, community and family engagement is recognized as the driving factor of student academic and social success. We work in combination with a variety of community partners including Communities in Schools, Auburn Food Bank, Washington State Soccer: Soccer for Success, YMCA, Kiwanis and Lions Clubs, Auburn Parks and Recreation, Washington State Smile Partners, AAA of Washington, King County Solid Waste, King County Library and Auburn Youth and Family Services. Our most important partners are our families. This year we are rolling out a new volunteer opportunity called WATCH DOGS (Dads of Great Students). What a wonderful opportunity to be involved in the lives of all of our students.

TITLE PROGRAM






ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS - Grades 3, 4 & 5




MATH - Grades 3, 4 & 5




SCIENCE - Grade 5
